

To be in compliance with the Detroit Benchmarking Ordinance, you must create an Energy Star Portfolio Manager with the following features:

- □ A property profile for all your required buildings
- □ A Detroit Building ID for all your required buildings in the Standard IDs sections
- 12 months of Energy and Water usage data for the required years
 - \circ $\:$ If your building is over 100,000 square feet: 2023 and 2024 usage data
 - If your building is over 25,000 square feet: 2024 usage data
- □ Share the building property profile of all your required buildings with the City of Detroit in Energy Star Portfolio Manager (Username: **DetroitSustainability**)
