HELLO MIGHTY DISTRICT 2! IT'S SUMMER! IT'S TIME TO DIVE IN! SPLASH!!! Detroit is a buzz with "politics" and perhaps, "Poli-tricks"? But D2 residents can rest assured that, as my Grandmother used to say, with D2 being led by Councilwoman Calloway (C-2), and your humble servant me, Police Commissioner Bernard, (PC-D2) "leading the charge" as your elected representatives..."You Have the Bases Loaded"! We both have spent a lifetime in the business of "Protecting and Serving the Community"! Councilwoman Calloway has opened her campaign office on Livernois in the gray - "All things Political" Building immediately south of Noni's Sherwood Grill. She is on the ballot and officially a candidate. All the community has to do is check the box - CALLOWAY! Unfortunately, unforeseen circumstances prohibited me from being on the ballot, so I am relying on Y_O_U, our D2 community, to write in my name, Linda Bernard on your ballot! My campaign is a WRITE IN CAMPAIGN, It's not exactly a household name, but I'm relying on Y-O-U to write it in on your ballot, like you did Mike Duggan (to get him elected as a write in candidate) a few years ago. But enough on me! Let's get down to POLICE BUSINESS AND PUBLIC SAFETY-MY PRIORITY! **FYI**- We recently promoted 27 Police Officers to Sergeant; 11 Sergeants to Lieutenant and 11 Lieutenants to Captain so you have 49 new people in command positions in the city! As part of its "Due Diligence", the BOPC reviewed disciplinary records and citizen complaints records of each nominee, prior to authorizing the promotions. All four D2 Precincts (12th; 10th; 8th; and 2nd) will benefit from these promotions. CONGRATULATIONS to all the new "Brass" nominated by Chief Bettison! As Chair of the powerful **BOPC POLICY COMMITTEE**, and as the Board's only attorney, the committee (consisting of Commissioners and Community Leaders) reviews: Policies and Police Special Orders with the objective of promoting Constitutional Policing by our officers; fostering strict adherence to our policies; and protection of the Constitutional Rights of civilians. Various special interest groups, i.e., ACLU, WSU Law School Reps, Citizens, are included. All are welcome. On a closing note, ALL city residents can be proud of the fact that the BOPC is two years ahead of the MI Legislature which recently introduced the police Practices, Standardization, Transparency and Trust Act in implementing police reforms recently introduced by Rep. Cynthia Chang and the Michigan Bipartisan Community Trust Committee to

the BOPC adopted policies more than a year ago addressed many of the reforms in the legislation. We all but eliminated "NO KNOCK WARRANTS" (Brianna Taylor) except in kidnapping, terrorism, etc., the most extreme situations. DPD officers also have a "DUTY TO INTERVENE" in the face of officer misconduct (George Floyd). Officers are required to use "DE-ESCALATION" techniques PRIOR TO USING FORCE, and all use of force must be "reasonable", and is reviewed by command officers as to reasonableness and necessity and OCI, if there is a citizen's complaint. DPD Officers can be disciplined for disabling their body cams and are disciplined for domestic violence arrests. The S.T.A.T. Act does standardize testing procedures for MI Commission on Law Enforcement Standards; allows an officer's license to revoked for a finding of guilt for misdemeanor domestic violence; requires a separate record/ files for officer misconduct; and eliminates the protection of officers for untruthful, compulsory statements.


