RE: RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF CONTINUED FUNDING FOR THE ACCESIBILI-

D PROGRAM

City Council President Mary Sheffield has requested the Legislative Policy Division (LPD) to produce a resolution urging our state and federal partners to provide funding that would allow the City to extend or relaunch the Accessibili-D service.

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF CONTINUED FUNDING FOR THE ACCESIBILI-D PROGRAM

- **WHEREAS** The Accessibili-D pilot program launched in June 2024 to close transportation gaps for seniors and disabled residents by providing a free shuttle service utilizing autonomous vehicles; and
- **WHEREAS** The program was operated by May Mobility in partnership with the City of Detroit's Office of Mobility Innovation and the Michigan Mobility Collaborative; and
- WHEREAS The free shuttle operated across 128 stops with an 11-square mile area of southeast Detroit with 3 vehicles, including two wheelchair-accessible vehicles, that helped participants reach healthcare facilities, shopping centers, workplaces, and social or recreational destinations; and
- WHEREAS The pilot program ran through June 2025 and was a resounding success with over 4,000 rides provided, a 5.0 star rating across over 700 reviews, and an average wait time of only 10 minutes; and
- **WHEREAS** The program was supported by a \$2.4 million contract with additional grant funding, including a \$206,000 grant from the Delta Dental Foundation; and
- WHEREAS According to the Detroit Office of Disability Affairs, Detroit has approximately 117,000 residents with disabilities, making up roughly 18% of the population; and
- WHEREAS The Office of Mobility Innovation has stated its intention to issue a Request for Proposals in the coming months and have a long-term contract in place by the end of the year, while also working with the Detroit Department of Transportation to provide gap services; and
- WHEREAS Programs like Accessibili-D provide disabled residents with additional freedom and independence by making it free and convenient to travel; and
- **WHEREAS** Given the popularity and success of the program, its renewal and expansion should be a priority, as Detroit could become a model for accessible, tech-enabled mobility; and
- WHEREAS The continuation of the Accessibili-D program would reaffirm the City's commitment to inclusive transit solutions that improve independence, dignity, and opportunity for all residents; NOW, THEREFORE BE IT,
- RESOLVED The Detroit City Council hereby urges our state and federal partners to provide the funding necessary to relaunch and potentially extend the Accessibli-D service; NOW BE IT FINALLY
- **RESOLVED** That the Detroit City Clerk provide a copy of this resolution to AECOM, the American Center of Mobility, Urbanite by Ford Motor Company, Deloitte, the Knight Foundation, Mcity at the University of Michigan, the Michigan Department of Transportation, the US Department of Transportation, the University of Michigan Transportation Research Institute, and Wayne State University.
