**RE: AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARPA) FUNDS STATUS AS OF JANUARY 31, 2025**

This report is intended to give your Honorable Body an appropriation level status as of January 31, 2025, of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds that the City of Detroit was awarded by the U. S. Department of Treasury.

As your Honorable Body knows, City of Detroit was awarded \$826.7 million<sup>1</sup> allocation from the U. S. Department of Treasury. This was part of the \$350 billion emergency funding for eligible state, local, territorial, and tribal governments as part of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 that congress passed and President Biden signed into law on March 11, 2021.

On June 29, 2021, the Administration presented a budget amendment to the City Council and the Council approved it. This was a collaborative effort between the Administration and City Council and funds were appropriated into 15 different appropriations to ensure citizens of Detroit receive the best possible benefits from these funds in order to alleviate the COVID-19 economic challenges our residents have been experiencing since start of the Pandemic.

It is important to note that the City of Detroit has obligated all the \$826.7 million in ARPA dollars as of December 31, 2024, in accordance with the requirements of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. In addition, the City is required to spend all the ARPA dollars by December 31, 2026, per the Act.

As of January 31, 2025, the City has spent \$495.5 million (including \$29.3 million spent in FY 2022, \$97.4 million spent in FY 2023, \$245.5 million spent in FY 2024, and \$123.3 million spent in FY2025): \$78.9 million on payroll and another \$416.6 million on contractual services. We should note that through January

31, 2025, City of Detroit spent 59.9% of the \$826.7 million ARPA funds, while 40.1% of these funds are available for use.

Below is a summary of the total allocation of the \$826.7 million in ARPA dollars by appropriation, obligations, actual expenditures, and funds available as of January 31, 2025.
