**RE:** Proposed Ordinance amendment on 50% Budget Allocation to Elected Offices

The Legislative Policy Division has been requested by Council Member Latisha Johnson to draft a proposed amendment to the City Code providing that the elected offices of City Council, Mayor and City Clerk budget appropriations are divided into two separate allocations. The separate allocation would occur only in an election year to ensure equal funding for newly elected officials. In an election year for City of Detroit offices, the budget appropriation would provide 50% in a budget allocation for the first six months of the fiscal year and 50% would be separately allocated for the final six months of the fiscal year. LPD submits this draft amendment to the Detroit City Council for referral to the Law Department for review and approval as to form.
