These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities undertaken by the City of Detroit.

**REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS**

On or about October 17, 2025, the City of Detroit will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Detroit Field Office for the release of 1. Project Based Vouchers from the Detroit Housing Commission, and 2. Community Development Block Grant disaster recovery (CDBG-DR) funds appropriated by the Disaster Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2022 Public Law 117-43, to undertake a project known as:

Project Title: Preserve on Ash II; 3001, 3015, 3021, and 3029 14<sup>th</sup> Street, Detroit, Michigan.

For the Purpose Of: Creating 31 units of affordable housing in the North Corktown neighborhood as part of the Choice Neighborhood Grant. The project includes acquisition and new construction of a one four-story apartment building containing 11 one-bedroom, 17 two-bedroom, and 3 three-bedroom units. The project amenities will include centralized management and maintenance offices, community room/lounge, additional residential storage, bike storage and exterior recreational space. 18 parking spaces will be provided to residents.

Mitigation Measures/Conditions/Permits: 1. Remedial action must be employed under the guidance of the Michigan EGLE to address onsite contaminants. 2. Hours of construction shall be in accordance with local code to mitigate temporary construction phase noise.

### **ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION**

The City of Detroit certifies to HUD that Ms. Julie Schneider, in her capacity as Director of the Housing and Revitalization Department at the City of Detroit, consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the recipients to use Program funds.

### **OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS**

HUD will accept objections to its release of fund and the City of Detroit's certification for a period of fifteen (15) days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Detroit; (b) the City of Detroit has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient has committed funds or incurred costs not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to the U. S.
