## Who is required?

All buildings over 25,000 square feet are **required** to report their energy and water data from the previous calendar year, **by June 1 of every year**

### Free Technical Assistance for select building types

Affordable Multifamily, Houses of Worship, Childcare Facilities and Non-profits are eligible to receive technical assistance with compliance through an EGLE grant.
