Buildings, Safety, Engineering and Environmental Department (BSEED) – Environmental Affairs (EA) Fugitive Dust Plan Review Requirements outlines requirements and obligations for dust-generating community establishments, including existing and future Bulk Solids facilities. It is important to note that:

- Sec. 8-15-582(c): The submission of a fugitive dust plan, or revision, shall not relieve any persons subject to requirements of this ordinance from compliance with any Federal laws, State of Michigan laws, or this code, and;
- <u>Sec. 8-15-582 (d):</u> Any other law, regulation, or permit shall not relieve any person from submitting a fugitive dust plan, as required by this ordinance

Fugitive dust plans are required to be submitted to and approved by BSEED before any new construction can begin. Additionally, a community establishment shall notify the Director of BSEED in writing of changes in operation or expansions at least 30 days before the expansion or change in operation occurs.

Alternative Compliance (Sec. 8-15-593)

A community establishment will be deemed in compliance if:

- a) The community establishment is an agency or department of BSEED and has submitted a single fugitive dust plan to BSEED.
- b) The community establishment has submitted a state operating plan for the facility to BSEED, the plan is effective, and the establishment is deemed in compliance, and the community establishment is relying upon a state operating plan for compliance.
 - i. BSEED reviews state operating plan and inspects the community establishment for compliance.
- c) If the community establishment is reliant on a state permit that isn't an operating plan, the community establishment shall file the permit with BSEED with supplemental information to document compliance, and an application for alternative compliance will be registered. BSEED will issue a permit after reviewing and inspecting the community establishment for compliance.

If alternative compliance is not applicable, the requirements of a community establishment's Fugitive Dust plan are below:
