RESOLUTION URGING THE ADMINSTRATION TO DEVELOP AN OCCUPIED HOME REHABILITATION PROGRAM UTILIZING HUD SECTION 108 LOANS

- **WHEREAS,** The mission of the Detroit City Council is to promote the economic, cultural and physical welfare of Detroit's citizens and residents through Charter-mandated legislative functions; and
- WHEREAS, The Planning and Development Department (P&DD) is charged with establishing a strategic plan that pursues, advocates and supports community development within the City, consistent with the Master Plan, including the creation and support of stable planned communities; and
- WHEREAS, The mission of the Housing and Revitalization Department (HRD) is to finance, underwrite, and administer housing and community investments that enhance the quality of life for the citizens of Detroit; and
- WHEREAS, The Detroit Land Bank Authority (DLBA) over the years has obtained title to approximately 700 properties that are occupied in its inventory, many of which are occupied and technically uninhabitable in violation of City Code requirements for safe and habitable housing; and
- WHEREAS, The City of Detroit through HRD and P&DD has the ability to utilize funding programs such as the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), Section 108 Loans for the purpose of funding the temporary relocation of the occupants while the property is being rehabilitated and to fund the actual rehabilitation of the property; and
- WHEREAS, The development of a City program administered through HRD and P&DD to utilize HUD Section 108 loans with the assistance of nonprofit subrecipients to rehabilitate the uninhabitable occupied properties that are currently owned by the DLBA would serve to safeguard the safety and welfare of the Detroit residents occupying these properties; and BE IT THEREFORE
- **RESOLVED,** The Detroit City Council urges the Administration to develop a program by and through HRD and P&DD that utilizes HUD Section 108 loans with the assistance of nonprofit subrecipients for the purpose of rehabilitating the uninhabitable occupied properties that are currently owned by the Detroit Land Bank Authority; and **BE IT FINALLY**
