





Community Benefits Monitoring and Enforcement by CRIO

The Civil Rights, Inclusion, and Opportunity Department (CRIO) monitors Tier 1 Projects under the Community Benefits Ordinance

TIER 1 PROJECTS ARE:







OPEN BIDDING

CRIO is responsible for <u>monitoring and enforcing</u> <u>Community Benefits Provisions</u>

- CRIO sends the developer a biannual CBO status request letter and a reporting form with targeted questions. This form requires the developer to provide specific updates on all commitments
- CRIO reviews the submitted information, requests a project walkthrough, documented proofs and/or additional clarification
- CRIO meets with various departments to verify submitted information
- CRIO then generates a report. Reports can we found online at: https://detroitmi.gov/departments/civil-rights-inclusion-opportunity-department/about-crio/compliance-team

Earlier in 2025, The Future of Health completed its self-reporting, as mandated by the Community Benefits Ordinance.

CRIO has reviewed the information presented, investigated, and verified the claims made by The Future of Health team and the City Departments associated with each provision.



- 1. Whether the Developer is in compliance with the Community Benefits Provision
- 2. How the Community Benefits Provision will be enforced or how violations will be mitigated

Stage 3: NAC disagrees with Enforcement Committee findings

If NAC disagrees
with findings or
determines that
the EC is not
diligently
pursuing
enforcement NAC may send
notice to EC which
will have 14 days
to respond



City Council may
elect to hold a
hearing to
determine if the EC
has made
reasonable efforts to
ensure developer
compliance.

Based on its findings, City
Council can require follow up action
from the EC and/or developer.





Housing for Detroiters

Driving Housing Accessibility and Stability for Detroit Residents

1. Expanding Affordable Housing for Detroit Families

Committed 20% of residential units to deeply affordable units for 30 years and acceptance of Section 8 vouchers to increase housing stability for low-income households.

2. Home Repair and Rental Assistance

Allocation of \$2 million for owner-occupied home repairs and \$500,000 for rental assistance in the impact area, helping residents maintain safe, stable housing.

3. Advancing Inclusive, Long-Term Affordability

Funding \$2 million for affordable housing preservation, launched a Community Land Trust with \$250,000, and incorporated universal design principles to ensure accessibility and protect affordability for future generations.











Career Opportunities

Empowered Detroit and the Region Through Economic Opportunity and Workforce Development

1. Expanded Career Pathways

Hosted 50 job fairs (in-person or virtual) in Detroit. Engaged 150+ students through apprenticeship awareness events and connected hundreds of Detroiters to job opportunities via multiple career fairs at Wayne State University and Henry Ford Hospital.

2. Built Talent Pipelines

Enabled tuition-free, paid programs for Nursing and Medical Assistants, which resulted in **37 graduates** now employed full-time at Henry Ford Health.

3. Invested in Detroit's Future

Over \$100 million awarded to local businesses, and partnered with HBCUs to strengthen the City and Regional economy and workforce.























Education

Opportunities for Learning and Growth Through Scholarships, Resources, and Career Pathways

1. Expanded Educational Access

Provided emergency medical kits to local high schools and launched programs supporting 27 students in health professions, with recruitment underway for the next cohort.

2. Scholarships and College Support

Committed \$450,000 to mentorship programs, up to \$300,000 for room and board assistance, and awarded over \$100,000 in scholarships, while progressing toward 50 full tuition-free scholarships.

3. Developed Career Pathways in Healthcare

Introduced mentorship and job shadowing initiatives, including *Destination Success* and *HFH Career Bridge Program*, to expose students to healthcare careers and provide hands-on experiences.

Finest Healthcare for Detroiters and Beyond

Building Health Equity and Access for Detroit Communities

1. Expanding Urgent & Primary Care Access

Project to enable streamlined emergency intake, planned same-day primary care clinics, and dedicated behavioral health spaces to ensure timely, comprehensive care for Detroit residents.

2. Strengthening Community Health Support

Held **549 health screenings** and **60 health education outreach** meetings in the community. Deployed health workers and educators to senior housing to improve navigation, provide screenings, and deliver wellness education in neighborhoods.

3. Advancing Maternal Health

Enrolled 126 mothers in group prenatal care to reduce infant mortality and promote healthy births via Women-Inspired Neighborhood (WIN) Network: Detroit. Added Breastfeeding Peer Counselors at New Center One and Ford Road. Added a CHW to support patients screened for non-medical health drivers by the Obstetric Nurse Navigator. Additional services include community doula support for Medicaid patients at Henry Ford Hospital.















Community Building

Building Strong Community
Connections in Detroit

1. Strengthening Community Engagement and Partnership

Sponsored 18 groups in the community including Hoopfest and neighborhood celebrations. Hosted community fairs with City and partners, reaching hundreds of residents with health, education, and job resources.

2. Investing in Local Support

\$200,000 to support 360 Detroit and \$15,000 annually for the Pistons Wheelchair Team; **\$300,000 in micro-grants** to neighborhood organizations.

3. Enhancing Safety and Infrastructure

Installed security cameras and blue light phones across the development; began construction of a **1,500-space parking garage** and completed a traffic study to improve site access and planning.









