CHAPTER 2. ADMINISTRATION

DIVISION 2. ELECTED OFFICIALS COMPENSATION COMMISSION

Sec. 2-3-16. Created.

There is hereby created an elected officials compensation commission which shall determine the salaries of all city elected officials.

Sec. 2-3-17. Composition; appointment and terms of members; filling of vacancies.

The elected officials compensation commission shall consist of seven (7) members who are registered electors of the city, appointed by the mayor subject to confirmation by a majority of the members elected to and serving on the city council. The terms of office shall be seven (7) years; except, that of the members first appointed, one each shall be appointed for terms of one (1), two (2), three (3), four (4), five (5), six (6) and seven (7) years. All first members shall be appointed within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this division. Thereafter members shall be appointed before October first of the year of appointment. Vacancies shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term. No member or employee of the legislative, judicial or executive branch of any level of government or members of the immediate family of such member or employee shall be eligible to be a member of the commission.

Sec. 2-3-18. Determination of salaries for city elected officials; expense allowances; etc.

The elected officials compensation commission shall determine the salaries of city elected officials which determination shall be the salaries unless the city council by resolution adopted by two-thirds of the members elected to and serving on the city council reject them. The determination of the commission shall be effective thirty (30) days following their filing with the city clerk unless rejected by the city council. In case of rejection, the existing salary shall prevail. Any expense allowance or reimbursement paid to elected officials in addition to salary shall be for expenses incurred in the course of city business and accounted for to the city.

Sec. 2-3-19. Meetings; quorum; election of chairman; compensation of members.

The elected officials compensation commission shall meet for not more than fifteen (15) session days in 1972 and every odd numbered year thereafter and shall make its determination within forty-five (45) calendar days of its first meeting. A majority of the members of the commission constitute a quorum for conducting the business of the commission. The commission shall take no action or make determinations without a concurrence of a majority of the members appointed and serving on the commission. The commission shall elect a chairman from among its members. "Session days" means any calendar day on which the commission meets and a quorum is present. The members of the commission shall receive no compensation, but shall be entitled to their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

Sec. 2-3-20. Assistance from city clerk.

The city clerk shall provide such administrative assistance as the elected officials compensation commission shall reasonably require.
