

Petition No. 289 – SME on behalf of Wolverine Cold Storage request for an encroachment with a non-standard driveway on the west side of Dequindre Street, 78 feet wide, between Mack Avenue, variable width, and Canfield Avenue, 60 feet wide.

The petition was referred to the City Engineering Division – DPW for investigation and report. This is our report.

The request is being made in conjunction with a new development for the Wolverine Cold Storage Facility. The driveway is non-standard in size in order to provide an adequate turning radius for the truck traffic entering and exiting the facility to and from Dequindre Street.

The request was approved by the Solid Waste Division – DPW, and the Traffic Engineering Division – DPW, and City Engineering Division – DPW.

Detroit Water and Sewerage Department (DWSD) reports being involved, but they have no objection provided the DWSD encroachment provisions are followed. The DWSD provisions have been made a part of the resolution.

The Effects of Sports Betting on Casino Development Agreements

The Legislative Policy Division was requested by Council Member Spivey to respond to concerns relating to the recent U.S. Supreme Court's decision striking down Michigan's Professional and Amateur Sport Protection Act, which banned sports betting. In response to this, a number of bills have been introduced in Lansing to allow sports betting within the state. A description of each and its potential impact on the development agreements of Detroit's casinos will be discussed below.

#### House Bill 4060

This bill amends the Michigan Gaming Control and Revenue Act ("Gaming Control Act"), Initiated Law 1 of 1996) to allow the holder of a casino license to accept wagers on sporting events. The approval of voters statewide and in Detroit would be necessary in order for this act to take effect.

If passed, all three casinos would have the authority to have add sports gaming at their locations. This change would not necessitate any amendments to the casinos' development agreements. This sports betting would just be another gaming activity allowed under the Gaming Control Act. These activities would be taxed in the same manner as all other casino gaming. Currently, the wagering tax in effect for the City of Detroit is 10.9% of the adjusted gross receipts.

#### House Bills 4742 & 4743 (Senate Bills 461 & 462)

House Bill 4743 creates the "Fantasy Sports Games Consumer Protection Act". Under the act, betting on fantasy sports games would be authorized if conducted by a licensed game operator. Operator licenses would be issued by the Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs at a cost of \$5,000 for the first year and \$1,000 for each renewal year.

Currently, fantasy sports games are allowed within the state and the activities are ongoing. These activities are not considered gaming within the preview of the Michigan Gaming Control Board. This bill will essentially create a licensing scheme and will prohibit fantasy sports games based on a university, college, high school or youth sporting event.

The passage of H.B. 4743 would have no impact on Detroit's casinos as these activities are already allowed under current law. Therefore, no amendments to the development agreement are necessary nor will there be any impact on the City's revenues.

House Bill 4742 is an amendment to the Michigan Penal Code. Under the current law, there is an exception to the general prohibition on gambling that allows the following in connection with a race, contest or game under the Michigan Exposition and Fairgrounds Authority Act: give or pay purses or prizes to the payers in a game or contest, to pay entry fees or pay expenses or a reward for services or labor. The bill extends this exception under two other circumstances. The first is when it applies to an athletic game or contest 1) where the sponsor or operator is not a player or participant, 2) the performance of the payer or participant relative to the perform of other sis determinative of the outcome and 3) the prizes and awards offered to winning participants are established and made know to the participants in advance of the game or contest. According to the House Fiscal Agency, this change was written to legalize office pools and betting on brackets which are rarely enforced are illegal. The second circumstance is when the game or contest is a fantasy or simulation sports game.

Although there was some speculation that HB 4742 would remove the prohibition on sports betting, the bill was not written with that intention.

#### House Bills 4926, 4927 & 4928 (Senate Bills 203, 204 & 205)

House Bill 4926 proposes the Lawful Internet Gaming Act, which seeks to legalize internet gaming and create a licensing scheme. "Internet gaming licenses" are created and may only be issued to a person that holds a casino license under the Michigan Gaming Control and Revenue Act, *i.e.* the Detroit casinos. Additionally, the tribal casinos also conduct internet gaming pursuant to a new or amended compact negotiated and approved by the Governor. An internet gaming license would be valid for 5-years with a \$200,000 initial licensing fee and renewed annually for \$100,000.

The act also creates two additional licensing opportunities—internet gaming vendor license and gaming platform vendor provider license. An internet gaming vendor licensee is a person providing to an internet game licensee goods, software, or services that directly affect the wagering, play and results of the authorized internet games. This would be 5-year license for a \$5000 fee, renewable for an additional 5 years at a cost of \$2,500.

The internet gaming platform provider licensee is not specifically defined; however, a "internet gaming platform" is an integrated system of hardware, software, and servers through which an internet gaming licensee conducts internet gaming. This would be an annual license for \$100,000, renewal for \$50,000 each year thereafter.

The bill would create The Division of Internet Gaming (the Division) within the Michigan Gaming Control Board to administer, regulate, and enforce the system of internet gaming. The Division would have jurisdiction over all licensees and enforcement under the act.

An "Internet Gaming Fund" would be created using the application and licensing fees. This fund will be invested by the State Treasurer. The funds will be appropriated in the following manner: 1) \$1,000,000 annual contribution to the Compulsive Gaming Prevention Act and 2) to fund the cost of the regulation and enforcement of the act.

An internet gaming licensee would be subject to an 8% tax on the gross gaming revenue from internet gaming conducted under the act. According to the House Fiscal Agency, the bills likely would result in a net reduction in revenues for state and local governments, including the City of Detroit, mainly due to the tax and revenue structure differences between the proposed online gaming and existing gaming sources. The tax revenue would be distributed as follows:

- 55% to the city in which the internet gaming licensee's casino is located, *i.e.* the City of Detroit,
- 35% to the State to be deposited in the Internet Gaming Fund,
- 5% to deposited in the State School Aid Fund, and
- 5% to be deposited in the Michigan Transportation Fund

Currently, the City of Detroit receives a 10.9% casino wagering tax on the casino adjusted gross revenues for activities at the brick and mortar locations. However, the casino wagering tax for internet gaming revenues would be only 4.4%. For every \$1 in gross gaming revenues that was transferred from a brick and mortar casino to internet gaming the net result would be loss of 6.5 cents. For the City of Detroit to receive an equal amount of revenue, internet gaming would have to bring in \$2.47 in gross gaming revenues for every \$1 reduction in brick and mortar casino gross gaming revenues.

Additionally, the City stands to lose revenues from the Municipal Services Fee that each casino pays. Currently, the City receives the greater of 1.25% of adjusted gross receipts or \$4.0 million. For every dollar lost at from a brick and mortar casino to internet gaming, there would be a lost of 1.25 cents. The City would not receive any Municipal Service Fee revenue from internet gaming.

House Bill 4927 would add a section to the Michigan Penal Code that specifies that internet gaming conducted pursuant to HB 4926 is not illegal gambling.

House Bill 4928 amends the Code of Criminal Procedure to make violations of Section 13 of HB 4926 is a Class D Felony. The prohibited actions are as follows:

- 1. Offering internet gaming without an internet gaming license;
- 2. Knowingly making a false statement on an application for a license; and
- 3. Knowingly providing a false testimony to the Michigan Gaming Control Board while under oath.

If passed, all three casinos would have the authority to obtain a license to offer internet gaming. This activities include but are in no way limited to taking of sports wagers. It does not appear that this change would necessitate any amendments to the casinos' development agreements.
