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











Detroit Winter Wonderland / / Cadillac Square Programming Diagram





The Junior-T Model Orangerie is a 10.41.5120.275.6060 pre-fabricated aluminum greenhouse covered with 4mm thick tempered glass panels. A photograph of the greenhouse can be found in the appendix of this letter.

Based upon our analysis, we have concluded that the greenhouse as currently Installed by Exaco Trading Co. Is adequate to support the following loads per the 2015 International Building Code:

Wind Load: 120 MPH (3-second gusts) Snow Load: 35 PSF (ground-snow load)

Roof Live Load: 20 PSF

Our structural analysis and conclusions assume that the greenhouse is installed with a minimum 8"x16" tall concrete beam or solld-grouted masonry foundation continuous below the perimeter of the greenhouse walls. 

Responsibility for alleys

During meetings of the Public Health and Safety standing committee in September 2018, Council Member McCalister inquired regarding the City government agency with responsibility for alleys.

In response to this inquiry, Article VI of the City Code, Sections 50-6-1 through 50-6-8, is attached. It is entitled "CONVERSION OF ALLEYS TO EASEMENTS IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS". It authorizes vacating an alley or a portion thereof in a residential area upon petition of two-thirds of owners of abutting properties.

The ordinance states that upon receipt of such a petition, Council shall transmit it to the former "community and economic development department." By current practice, the responsibilities for alley closures formerly entrusted to that defunct department have been taken over by the City Engineering Division of the Department of Public Works (DPW). (see. E.g., attached memorandum dated July 18, 2018 from City Engineer Richard Doherty)

The ordinance goes on to specify the roles of the Law Department, City Council, the City Clerk, and the Director of Public Works in the process of vacating an alley in whole or part, depending on the request made by the specific petition.

If Council has any other questions or concerns regarding this subject, LPD will be happy to provide further research and analysis upon request.

ARTICLE VI. - CONVERSION OF ALLEYS TO EASEMENTS IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS

Sec. 50-6-1. - Petition by two-thirds of abutting property owners required; investigation and report by community and economic development department.

A petition for the vacating of any dedicated alley or portion thereof in a residential area in the city shall be presented to the city council by not less than two-thirds (2/3) of the owners of the property abutting on such alley or portion thereof sought to be vacated who shall signify, in writing, their consent to the granting of such petition. Where property owners elect to keep the alley open either due to the need to gain access to their garages or for reasons verified and approved by the director of the department of public works, they shall be responsible for the cleanliness and maintenance of the alley. If found in a littered condition, as defined under sections 22-2-84 and 22-2-85 of this Code, the director of the department of public works shall be authorized to barricade said alley as he or she deems necessary. No action shall be taken by the city council regarding petitions for alley conversion until a complete investigation and report thereon shall have been made by the community and economic development department.

(Code 1964, § 58-5-1; Ord. No. 267-H, § 1(58-5-1), 7-5-78; Ord. No. 31-93, § 1, 12-1-93)

Sec. 50-6-2. - Transmittal of petition by city council to community and economic development department.

Upon the receipt of a petition the city council shall, by its clerk, transmit such petition to the community and economic development department.

(Code 1964, § 58-5-2; Ord. No. 267-H, § 1(58-5-2), 7-5-78)

Sec. 50-6-3. - Duties of community and economic development department generally.

When a petition for the vacation of an alley, as provided in this article, has been received by the community and economic development department, the department shall be chargeable with the following duties:

- (1) It shall prepare a sketch to clearly define the alley or portion thereof sought to be vacated and shall show the property abutting thereon.
- (2) It shall cause to be made a list of the owners of all the property abutting on such alley or portion thereof to be vacated.
- (3) It shall check the petition and shall determine whether or not the owners of two-thirds or more of the property abutting on such alley or portion thereof sought to be vacated shall have signified, in writing, their consent to the granting of such petition.
- (4) It shall cause an investigation to be made as to the objection of any dissenting abutting property owners who refuse consent to the granting of such petition, and shall obtain from the law department an opinion as to the legal merit of such objections.
- (5) It shall contact all other necessary city departments and outside utility companies and shall ascertain the need for such alley for the carrying on of such public services, such as garbage and rubbish collection, sewer maintenance or any other such public service, and shall make a determination as to whether or not adequate provisions can be made for such services and for all utilities purposes through the creation of an easement.
- (6) When such investigation has been completed, the community and economic development department shall make a full written report of its findings and shall make such recommendation

- (b) Upon the receipt of a copy of the resolution, the director of the department of public works shall correct the official city maps and records.
- (c) Upon the receipt of a copy of the resolution, the department of public works shall adjust its municipal refuse collection services accordingly.

Sec. 50-6-8. - Article no limitation of regulatory powers of city council.

Nothing in this article shall be construed to limit any regulatory powers possessed by the city council with respect to the vacation of any street, alley or public place within the boundaries of the city.

Petition No. 1847 of XLNC INVEST LLC, request for the renewal of the temporary closure of the north-south public alley, 18 feet wide (previously closed on a temporary basis by a resolution adopted on November 20, 2012 J.C.C. pages 2300-01); also the east-west public alley, 18 feet wide, all in the block of Elmira Avenue, 60 feet wide, Plymouth Avenue, 86 feet wide, Winthrop Avenue, 60 feet wide, and Greenfield Avenue, 106 feet wide.

The petition was referred to the City Engineering Division - DPW for investigation (utility review) and report. This is our report.

The last petition (#2224) to temporarily close the referenced north-south alley was granted by City Council on November 20, 2012 J.C.C. pages 2300-01 for a period of 5 years has expired. The property owner at 11245 – 11385 Greenfield uses the alleys as access to parking for the apartments and wishes to provide safe secure access and prevent illegal dumping in the alleys.

All involved City departments and privately owned utility companies have reported no objections to the proposal, provided they have the right to ingress and egress at all times to their facilities.
