

Where any street banner is found to present an immediate threat of harm to the public health, welfare or safety, the City shall summarily cause its removal.

If the City removes banners because they are in disrepair, present a threat or harm, or because the permit has expired, it is understood and agreed that a portion or all of the refundable deposit will be forfeited by the permittee in order to cover the City's expense. If the expense of removal exceeds the amount of deposit, it is understood and agreed that the excess amount shall be collected from the person/entity to which the permit was issued,







Petition No. 147 of Intersection Consulting Group on behalf of Ciena Healthcare and the Eastwood Skilled Nursing Home Replacement project, request for the vacation of the south ½ of the north-south public alley, 18 feet wide, in the block bounded by Hendricks Avenue, 50 feet wide, Hunt Street, 50 feet wide, Dubois Avenue, 50 feet wide and Chene Street, 60 feet wide; also for dedication of an alley outlet onto Chene Street in the same block.

(Special Land Use Hearing # 18-17)

Comcast reports involvement with for removal and relocation of their facilities. Comcast has received payment and is in the process of rerouting fibers, and scheduling the fibers splicing for a later date as dispatch allows to splice in the new fibers.

DTE Energy – Electric Division (DTE-E) reports being involved with electric facilities in the vacation area. The estimated cost for removing and rerouting their services is \$19,570.61 to remove 2 poles, 3 spans of primary conductors, 1 span of secondary

This \$15 million project will be the first new construction, skilled nursing facility built in the City of Detroit in over forty years.





Thank you for your response to my request for additional DDOT funding to expand and enhance services. Please provide the following additional information:

- The administration has indicated it will add funding for four Bus Ambassadors as a pilot study in the upcoming fiscal year, including the bus shelter team. What is the expected amount of funding that will be allocated for each program? How did the Department arrive at four Bus Ambassadors? Given Detroit's size and the number of routes I encourage the administration to increase the number of Ambassadors to seven, which is equal to the number of Districts.
- Currently the proposed fare increase ordinance states that "[w]ith additional funding, the Detroit Department of Transportation will evaluate this fare structure to consider the inclusion of a reduced fare category for low income riders" (see page 9 Section 4). It is my understanding that the previous Equity Analysis took three months and cost \$90,000. Please provide a specific timeline for completion of the evaluation process, including the Equity Analysis, and modify the ordinance language to state that this evaluation process will be completed prior to the implementation of the fare increases.
- I urge DDOT to create an "affordable fare"/low-income category with rates no higher than the current rates in order to prevent an additional financial burden on DDOT riders.
