

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 1

ORGANIZATION

- 1.1 Name:** This organization shall be known formally as the **University of Detroit Jesuit High School and Academy Dads' Club**. For convenience, it may operate under the name **U of D Jesuit Dads' Club**, or such other name as may be approved from time to time by the membership. For purposes of these By-Laws, it shall be referred to hereinafter as the "Dads' Club".
- 1.2 Organization:** The Dads' Club shall be organized as a Michigan Non-Profit Corporation. It shall apply to the Internal Revenue Service and to all appropriate state and local tax authorities for exemption from tax. It shall operate in accordance with those laws, regulations and rules that shall from time to time govern Michigan Non-Profit Corporations and tax-exempt entities. If any portion of these By-Laws shall be found to contradict such laws, regulations or rules, that portion shall be considered void, in the same manner as if it had not been included herein.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE

- 2.1 Purpose:** The Dads' Club exists solely to support the educational and spiritual mission of the University of Detroit Jesuit High School and Academy (hereinafter "U of D Jesuit"). Members of the Dads' Club share a common belief that the personal development of the young men enrolled at U of D Jesuit, individually and as a community, will be enhanced through active involvement by fathers, guardians, custodians, relatives, or any

or the needs identified by the Officers or the President of the U of D Jesuit. In the event that the Dads' Club should be dissolved, then its business and affairs shall be wound up in timely manner and all its assets in excess of those necessary to pay for, or establish appropriate reserves against, all current, future, and contingent liabilities and expenses shall be either distributed in kind or sold and the proceeds of such sales distributed. All such liquidating distributions shall be made to or for the benefit of U of D Jesuit, or in its absence, the Society of Jesus Order or some other entity qualifying for tax exemption under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or its successor provision, as designated by the Dads' Club.

3.3 Prohibition: In no event shall any asset of the Dads' Club be transferred, distributed or used in any way to benefit directly any individual or entity other than U of D Jesuit, or in its absence, some other entity qualifying for tax exemption under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or its successor provision, as designated by the membership. Provide, however, that the foregoing prohibition shall not interpret to limit transactions in the normal course of business, including payment of reasonable compensation for goods and services provided to the Dads' Club. For such purposes reasonable compensation shall be determined by reference to the fair market value as evidenced by transactions conducted at arms-length between independent persons.

3.4 Restrictions: Notwithstanding the authority granted by Section 3.1 hereof, the membership shall not cause the Dads' Club to change its purpose, to cease all operations, to dispose of substantially all of its assets, or to take any other action that could reasonably be expected to prevent the Dads' Club from continuing business in due course, without specific authorization of its membership.

3.5 Nonprofit: The Dads' Club only intention is to act as a nonprofit organization for as long as it exists.

3.6 Fiscal Year: The Dads' Club shall operate on a fiscal year beginning July 1 of each calendar year and ending on June 30 of the following calendar year.

5.2 **Special Meetings:** Special meetings of the Dads' Club may be called at any time at the request of any Officer or at the written request of any Member. The date, time, place, purpose, and agenda shall be fixed by the one requesting the special meeting. The Secretary shall send notice to the membership of the date, time, place, purpose, and agenda. No business shall be conducted at a special meeting that is not directly related to the purpose stated in such notice.

5.3 **Conduct of Meetings:** The President shall preside at all meetings. In his absence, the Vice President shall preside. Any of the Officers may preside as a situation dictates. All action of the Dads' Club shall be by affirmative vote of the majority of those members present. Voting by proxy shall not be permitted.

5.4 **Consent:** Any action of the Dads' Club that could be taken at a regular meeting may be taken with the majority consent of the Officers in lieu of any meeting, provided, however, that in no case such officers obligate the Dads' Club for money, goods, or services, or incur liabilities on its behalf exceeding One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000). Said action will be on the agenda of the next scheduled regular meeting.

5.5 **Activities:** The activities of the Dads' Club shall generally be planned, organized and executed by teams of members, customarily headed by a Chair appointed by the Officers. Such teams shall operate under the direction and routine supervision of the Officers. Each team shall provide periodic updates to the Officers and shall submit a report to the Officers at the conclusion of the related activity. No team shall have the authority to enter into contracts, obligate the Dads' Club or otherwise incur liabilities on its behalf without specific authorization of the Officers.

6.7 **Treasurer:** The Treasurer shall be the chief financial officer of the Dads' Club. The Treasurer keep the books of the Dads' Club by retaining all check registers and bank statements for review. The Treasurer shall disburse funds and issue checks of the Dads' Club in accordance with the actions and policies of the Club. The Treasurer shall report on the financial affairs of the Dads' Club at each regular meeting. The Treasurer shall file with the IRS the yearly appropriate request to continue the Dads' Club tax exempt status.

ARTICLE VII

MISCELLANEOUS

7.1 **Liability:** No officer or member of the Dads' Club shall be liable to the Dads' Club for any action, or failure to act, by such officer or member on behalf of the Dads' Club and for its benefit if such action, or failure to act, was taken, or refrained from, in good faith and without gross negligence.

7.2 **Amendments:** These By-Laws may be amended at any time, and from time to time, by the affirmative vote of the majority of all members present at a meeting if due notice was provided to the members that amendments would be on the agenda and would be voted on prior to the meeting.
