



Thank you for submitting initial forms and related information. Determinations are based on Michigan laws for registering charities, the Charitable Organizations and Solicitations Act (COSA), MCL 400.271 et seq. and the Supervision of Trustees for Charitable Purposes Act (STCPA), MCL 14.251 et seq.

It appears this organization does not compensate staff or independent contractors for services related to fundraising. Additionally, the organization does not anticipate soliciting or receiving contributions in excess of \$25,000 in a 12-month period. Therefore, a Charitable Solicitation Registration is not required under COSA. If in the future, staff or independent contractors are paid for services related to fundraising or contributions exceed \$25,000 in a 12-month period, notify our office as registration under COSA will likely be required. The Charitable Solicitation Registration is separate from the requirements of the Bureau of State Lottery and other agencies.

It appears this organization holds assets in Michigan to be used for charitable purposes. The organization is now registered as a charitable trust under STCPA. Registration under STCPA requires an annual report. Annual financial accountings must be filed six (6) months following the close of each fiscal year. Accountings may be a copy of the IRS 990, 990-PF, 990-EZ, a certified audit, or other acceptable accounting. If the IRS does not require filing, you may submit a completed IRS 990 or 990-EZ to our office to fulfill the reporting requirement.
