In response to the request for a deferral of the demolition order on the property noted above, the Buildings, Safety Engineering and Environmental Department (BSEED) submits the following information:

A special inspection conducted on November 4, 2019, revealed that the building is secured and appears to be sound and repairable. The owner has paid all taxes and is current. The proposed use of the property is owner's use and occupancy. This is the 1st deferral request for this property.

Therefore, we respectfully recommended that the demolition order be deferred for a period of six months subject to the following conditions:

- 1. A permit for rehabilitation work shall be applied for within <u>ten</u> (10) <u>business days</u> from the date of the City Council decision.
- 2. BSEED will schedule a Progress Inspection within <u>forty-five</u> (45) <u>calendar days</u> from the date of the rehabilitation permit to determine whether substantial progress has been made. Thereafter, the owner must submit to BSEED detailed inspection reports, with photos showing evidence of the work completed, every <u>forty-five</u> (45) <u>calendar days</u>, for the duration of the rehabilitation work, to demonstrate that substantial progress has been made during the approved time frame for rehabilitation.
- 3. The building shall have all imminently hazardous conditions immediately corrected, be maintained, and securely barricaded until rehabilitation is complete. Rehabilitation work is to be completed within six (6) months, at which time the owner will obtain one of the following from this department:
  - Certificate of Acceptance related to building permits
  - Certificate of Approval as a result of a Housing Inspection
  - Certificate of Compliance, required for all rental properties
- 4. The owner shall not occupy or allow occupancy of the structure without a certificate (as outlined above).
- 5. The yards shall be maintained clear of overgrown vegetation, weeds, junk and debris at all times.
- 6. Prior to seeking a permit extension, the owner must contact BSEED and request to extend the deferral period.

We recommend that utility disconnect actions cease to allow the progress of the rehabilitation.

At the end of the deferral period, the owner must contact this department to arrange an inspection to evidence that conditions of the deferral have been satisfied and that there has been substantial progress toward rehabilitation. If the building becomes open to trespass or if conditions of the deferral are not followed, the deferral may be rescinded by the City Council at any time and we may proceed with demolition without further notice. In addition, pursuant to the Property Maintenance Code we will issue a Blight Violation Notice.

Any request exceeding three (3) deferrals must be made by petition to City Council through the office of the City Clerk.

CIOGS ORDINANCE PROPOSED MODIFICATIONS

I would like to propose the following changes to the *Community Input Over Government Surveillance* (CIOGS) Ordinance:

1. The inclusion of a legal definition for the term *surveillance* that identifies its tracking and identification components.

2. Language stating that surveillance technology (equipment, software and hardware) must qualify as such by the legal definition of surveillance and strictly pertain to technology used for surveillance activity.

3. Removal of all clauses which mandate the disclosure of the number of days and times surveillance technology is used by the department or acquired by other entities and/or jurisdictions.

4. Removal of the provision requiring the submission of a written report within 45 days of the initiation of the exigent circumstances.

5. Removal of the deployment specification which requires that departments disclose the factors that determine surveillance technology placement strategies.

6. Removal of the provision mandating the City Council to conduct a public hearing for each surveillance technology procured by a City department.

7. All clauses requiring that the police department provide a copy of the non-disclosure agreement should be amended to protect circumstances where the providing of such will compromise confidentiality.

8. Replacement of the phrase "whichever is sooner" with "whichever is greater" where it pertains to the use of approved surveillance technology in exigent circumstances.

9. All provisions directing City departments to produce confidential writings in the event of non-disclosure agreements should be removed. As privileged and confidential submissions are exclusive to the Law department, the Surveillance Technology Specification Reports may not be precluded from the public domain.

10. Sec. 17-5-454 (b) line 6 should read as:

"Included in the annual report required under Section 7-806 of the Charter, *Duties of the Chief of Police*, the Police Department must <u>include</u> an Annual Surveillance Technology Procurement Report <u>as part of the annual report of operations</u>."
