**RE:** Animal Care and Control Ordinance Amendment

I am requesting the following amendment to Section 6-2-1, subsection d, of the proposed Animal Care and Control Ordinance:

 No person shall own, harbor, keep, or shelter more than four animals of the same species over the age of four months in a single residence. Animals shall be properly licensed and registered on the effective date of this ordinance. New licenses shall not be issued for animals over the limit of four upon death or rehoming of animals formerly licensed at that residence.
