VIII. ROUNDTABLE:

- A. The Moderator will ask each panel member to provide a two-minute (2 Minute) overview from their role in the law enforcement and criminal justice systems.
- B. After each speaker has given the overview, the Moderator will ask speakers to address the following for the Board:
 - Evidence-based information on arrests, charges, bail/bond, sentences, jail releases, and other core factors related to instances and trends of criminal homicides and non-fatal shootings in 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, and so far in 2021.
 - The panelist's perspective of any pre-COVID 19 trends in homicides and non-fatal shootings – and ways to address those trends within the law enforcement and judicial systems.
 - The impact, if any, of recent criminal justice reforms.

- The lessons learned from the current pandemic about changes needed in our law enforcement and judicial systems to improve functions overall or to better address challenges created by public health crises.
- C. The Moderator will ask each speaker to wrap-up with a two-minute summary based on the panelist's role. Then the Moderator will return the meeting to the BOPC Chair.
