Thursday November 18, 2021 Virtual Meeting - Public Comments

Lieutenant Mark Young shared his support of the Detroit Police Department; Channel 7 interview on towing was very disturbing hold yourself accountable because that was awful. December 7, 1998 Officer Lloyd Michael Todd was shot in the face, another Officer lost his life and Officer Child was shot to make this city safe and apprehend three felons.

CAC Scott Boman asked for clarification on what complaints do or do not go through OCI. What complaints can be evaluated by BOPC? If complaints are not handled through OCI, then it should be indicated where someone would take that complaint. Also clarification regarding criminal matters when there are violation of policy and urge the Board to draft a policy.

The Chair replied that OCI handles non-criminal complaints.

Ms. Bernice Smith shared that Ms. Sharon Pannell lost another family member; advised women to protect themselves; support the assistance of Michigan State Police.

Questions on the budget are what is the total cost of each surveillance system? Facial Recognition, Green Light, ShotSpotter and what is the total cost of the patrol officers?
