- VIII. Chair's Report. Chairperson Holley reported on the following information:

"The Board mourns the loss of former Deputy Mayor and 36th District Court Chief Judge Honorable Adam Shakoor, who was America's first Muslim judge. Serving in various judicial capacities within Wayne County, Judge Shakoor fought for and ensured justice, fairness, and equality with regard to freedom of speech, freedom of religion, and Muslim religious practices. A renowned leader and trailblazer, Shakoor served as deputy mayor for the City of Detroit, becoming the first Deputy Mayor in the City's History. He also served as the personal attorney for civil rights' icon Rosa Parks. Let us please have a moment of silence.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE DEPARTMENT'S EXPANSION OF THE C.I.T. (CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM RESPONSE PILOT PROGRAM): We are proud of the Department in its recent announcement of its expansion of the Crisis Intervention Team (C.I.T.) Response Pilot Program, which is a community partnership between law enforcement, the Detroit Wayne Integrated Health Network's Mental Health and addiction professionals, and all other affected individuals and families. The Board has been a long-time advocate and supporter of the Department's mental health partnership and the coresponse model expansion within the precincts.
