Thursday July 7, 2022 Meeting - Public Comments

Lieutenant Mark Young expressed congratulations to the promotes'; outstanding presentation from the 9th Precinct, which should be a testament to the men and women of DPD. There is a call for federal, local and moral standards, which limits law enforcement contact. But there is no judicial system or prosecution reform. Our thoughts and prayers are with any victim, but we must not forget the law enforcement officers that are injured.
