4. Presentation

Jay C. Juergensen Water Manager

Having worked on the Jefferson Chalmers water project Mr. Juergensen spoke on the three concerns of keeping water out of basements, keeping water out of the canals, and keeping the combined system overflow (CSO) excess out of the Great Lakes. The Conner station is the largest in the state. The Conner station along with the Freud and Blue hill/Conner stations failed resulting in flooding. The Jefferson Chalmers area is no longer able to receive federal resources due to sitting in a flood plain.

Community investment in renovating four houses to sell at a lower rate should result in reinvestment into three to four more houses being renovated.
