MS. YOLANDA Y. CRAFT**

WHEREAS Ms. Yolanda Y. Craft is a dedicated and committed supporter of the City of Detroit and the Police Department's Seventh Precinct. She has been a resident for over 50 years, and her service and leadership are exemplified throughout the community; and

WHEREAS Ms. Craft is a product of the Detroit Public Schools system. After graduating from Murray Wright High School, she continued her education by earning a degree in Nursing. She worked at several hospitals in Metro Detroit before going into private home health care five years ago; and

WHEREAS Ms. Craft has always been involved in community relations and is dedicated to improving neighborhood safety and quality of life. She became an early and active member of the Pingree Park Radio Patrol. She later became a member of the Pingree Park Block Club; and

WHEREAS Ms. Craft founded the nonprofit organization Sister with a Purpose five years ago. The organization puts together care packages filled with everyday essentials for the homeless population. During the winter, she collects and distributes gently used blankets and outdoor wraps for the homeless; and

WHEREAS Ms. Craft volunteers at every Seventh Precinct event; just a few are National Night Out, Police Week, Alumni Picnic, and the numerous Coffee and Cake retirement and community gatherings. She helps identify families to adopt during the holiday season and assists with passing out toys and meals to the families. When officers of the Seventh Precinct are working long shifts, she prepares box lunches to ensure officers eat a well-balanced meal. Each Halloween, everyone knows Ms. Craft makes her famous chili for the community and passes out the best candy on the block.
