1 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: Good afternoon. My name is
2 Bryan Ferguson, Chairperson of the Board of Police
3 Commissioners. This meeting will now come to order. I
4 want to apologize for the delay we had. It was technical,
5 but we worked right through it. Our invocation is going
6 to be by Chaplain Maurice Pope. Chaplain Pope, are you
7 there?

8 CHAPLAIN POPE: Yes.

9 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: Yes, sir.

10 CHAPLAIN POPE: Let us pray. Our father, which are in
11 heaven, we thank you for this day, Mayor Duggan and the
12 City of Detroit, Chairperson Ferguson of the Board of
13 Police Commissioners and Chief White of the Detroit
14 Police Department. Father, we thank you for the many
15 wonderful people and things of the city of Detroit.
16 Father God, we ask that you open our hearts and minds of
17 the Board of Commissioners, the Detroit Police
18 Department, and the citizens of Detroit as we move into
19 our last meeting of this year. As we meet father, guide
20 the decision making to serve the people and protect those
21 of the city of Detroit, as well as the Detroit Police
22 Department. Father God, we thank you for those in
23 attendance and ask that you bless all in attendance with
24 a safe journey home in what's forecasted as a snow
25 apocalypse. Father, I acknowledge your son Jesus is the

1 reason for this season. We prayed for peace and joy in
2 the prosperous new Year. This we ask in Jesus' name.
3 Amen.

4 COMMISSIONERS: Amen.

5 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: Thank you, Chaplain Pope.
6 Thank you so much. Mr. Brown introduction of
7 commissioner, please.

8 MR. BROWN: Good afternoon, Mr. Chair

9 MR. BROWN: Chairperson Bryan Ferguson - Here.

10 MR. BROWN: Vice-Chairperson Annie Holt asked for an
11 Excuse.

12 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Jim Holley - Present.

13 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Bernard -

14 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Cedric Banks - Present.

15 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Willie E. Bell asked for an
16 excuse.

17 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Willie Burton -

18 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Lisa Carter asked for an
19 excuse.

20 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Riccardo Moore - Present.

21 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Jesus Hernandez - Present.

22 MR. BROWN: Commissioner QuanTez Pressley -

23 MR. BROWN: Mr. Chair, at this time, you do not have
24 a quorum.

25 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: Thank you. Thank you, Mr.

1 Brown. So we cannot approve the agenda and we cannot
2 approve the minutes. So we're going straight into
3 introduction of BOPC staff.

4 MR. BROWN: Good afternoon, Mr. Chair. Currently, we
5 have with us Ms. Theresa Blossom, heading to my left
6 acting, Acting Chief Investigator Cromwell, Attorney Adam
7 Saxby, Media Services are doing the recording, Mr. Don
8 Handyside is doing the court reporting, Ms. Jonya
9 Underwood, Ms. Candace Hayes. Our VIP people are Ms.
10 Marie Overall of State Representative Tyrone Carter's
11 Office. Mr. Chair, that's all I see.

12 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: How about any elected
13 officials or representatives?

14 MR. BROWN: I don't see any of those either, Mr.
15 Chair.

16 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: How about in the audience? I
17 think we see somebody from...

18 MR. BROWN: Vice President Ron Thomas from the DPOA
19 Association. I missed it.

20 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: All right. Once again, thank
21 you for attending this meeting of the BOPC for the police
22 commissioners. First of all, I would like to give a
23 special thank you to AC Hewlee on his promotion. Thank
24 you, sir. I missed him at the promotion ceremony that
25 happened on Monday. I want to tell you over that WCCC

1 inside the Denise Wellons-Glover Room. Oh my God, it was
2 packed. Ran out of seats. It was a well-deserved
3 promotion for everybody that got promoted. On Friday, the
4 BOPC was present for the new officers here that just got
5 their jobs here for the DPD to help keep us safe. I want
6 to say congratulations to them for a long career. We're
7 going to move right along. I want to say thank you to the
8 staff. Happy holidays for all the staff, Ms. Blossom, Ms.
9 Underwood, Ms. Hayes, Ms. White. I see Investigator
10 Cromwell back there. I say thank you. I want to thank
11 Media Services. You guys have been doing a fantastic job
12 and I heard you guys are going to be doing some upgrades
13 on our system here. We're going to be moving into the
14 wireless age, which is going to be a good thing. I want
15 to thank Commissioner Moore personally. for always
16 answering the call when I call him. No matter when, he's
17 going to answer - and Commissioner Hernandez. Wonderful.

18 COMMISSIONER BANKS: That's good.

19 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: Commissioner Banks, I want to
20 thank you for showing up. Commissioner Holley, I want to
21 thank you for showing up. That shows your commitment.
22 Assistant Chief, you're up.

23 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: Thank me for showing up too.

24 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: Always.

25 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: Good Afternoon, honorable

1 Board. My report is going to be very brief. Just a few
2 things I want to praise you of. As you know we currently
3 have 5 members of the department who are currently
4 disabled and recovering at home due to on duty injuries.
5 We have a sergeant out of the Second Precinct, 2 police
6 officers out of the Seventh Precinct and 2 police
7 officers out of the Ninth Precinct. Our Covid stats were
8 down from last week. Last week we had 27. We're currently
9 at 17 this week. All 17 are at home recovering from Covid
10 and their symptoms. Crime data. Currently in homicides,
11 we're 2% up for the year for homicide with just a little
12 bit more than a week ago. We'll turn that around.
13 However, our non-fatal shootings are down 9%.

14 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: I just want to bring that
15 into kind of context. Right. Last year we had 1,033 non-
16 fatal shootings. Currently we're at 937. That's a
17 decrease of 96. So where the percentage that says 9%, I
18 think it's significant to know we're almost down a
19 hundred from the previous year. Robberies, same thing.
20 You see that too. We're down 7% as the stats show, but
21 that really equates to minus 103 robberies from the
22 previous year. So during great work there. So for total
23 part 1 crime, we're down 11%, which is a difference of
24 1,618 part 1 crimes from the previous year. So, while
25 we're still looking at homicides, we're doing some great

1 work out there. We're doing a really great work with the
2 community, giving us information so we can solve some of
3 these crimes. Some of the things I'll be talking about
4 here shortly. Our drag racing and enforcement has ended
5 for the year.

6 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: I just want to give you a few
7 stats for that. We conducted over 604 traffic stops,
8 issued over 370 tickets, impounded over 144 vehicles. Of
9 that, 12 of those vehicles were reported stolen and
10 recovered. We arrested 58 felonies, 11 misdemeanors, and
11 we recovered 35 weapons just from that detail alone. As
12 you know the department is standing up here, CIT task
13 force or team, as we should call it. That'd be up first
14 of the year. So we talked about mental health. Let's talk
15 about how many runs we've handled this year alone. This
16 year alone, total mental health calls, which includes
17 mental violence, non-violent violent armed, one down,
18 overdose suicide, and suicide threats. We had 22,742
19 calls of which we serviced 18,000 of those calls roughly.
20 So you can see the need for us standing up the CIT unit.

21 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: Hopefully, we'll be able to
22 work with our local partners to kind of decrease that
23 fact, some of these runs coming in. So we got some great
24 things coming out in January as we go forward. A couple
25 of significant events. We talked about homicides. A lot

1 of our homicides, as you've probably been told throughout
2 the year, are domestic violence related. These next two
3 cases I'm going to talk about, well they're not
4 homicides, just domestic violence related. We had an
5 incident that occurred on Sunday, December 18th, at about
6 9:40 PM. The officers responded to the 15,600, excuse me
7 - 15,600 block of Ellis on a domestic violence stabbing.
8 **A Black male, 33, was suffering from a stomach wound that**
9 **was initiated by his 40-year-old girlfriend. The argument**
10 **was over a paycheck.**

11 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: Apparently, she did not bring
12 a paycheck home. Her argument is sued from there. She
13 asked the gentleman to leave the location. He refused to
14 do so. She pulled out a knife and then she proceeded to
15 stab him. So, again, another domestic violence incident.
16 She's currently been arrested, and she's being charged
17 for assault. The second incident we had was at the Ninth
18 Precinct. This incident was captured on the video from
19 inside the precinct. Boyfriend girlfriend again. The
20 girlfriend is 28 years old. The victim is 51 years old.
21 They pull up in the parking lot of the Ninth Precinct.
22 They both get engaged in a physical altercation. The
23 suspect, a female, she pulls out a weapon. She ends up
24 striking the victim with the handgun and discharges and
25 actually shoots him in the left shoulder.

1 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: She fled the scene, but later
2 because we put the information out on social media and on
3 the news, she ended up turning herself in. She's
4 currently awaiting charges at the Wayne County
5 Prosecutor's office. As we talked about drag race and
6 although we have ended at drag racing, it doesn't mean
7 we're not out here doing enforcement. You all probably
8 saw on December 5th 12:30 AM there was a social media
9 video that went viral where these individuals were doing
10 donuts in the middle of seven mile and Greenfield doing
11 what they call a ring of fire - excuse me, a circle of
12 death fire. So we initiated an investigation into that
13 with our Organized Crime. They worked closely with our
14 Crime Intel Unit, and they were able to gain knowledge of
15 this individual leveraging our technology.

16 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: We used Green Light video,
17 body-worn camera, and our license plate readers. We were
18 able to identify one of the vehicles involved, which was
19 a yellow Mustang. The plate had been removed, but we had
20 enough information to actually do a search warrant on the
21 individual's home. We did the search warrant there. We
22 recovered that vehicle. We were able to arrest an
23 individual who was a seen individual doing the ring of
24 fire. In that we seized a handgun and found out that he
25 was already a convicted felon. So he was arrested and

1 charged with felony possession. He's currently awaiting
2 charges along with the misdemeanor charges for drifting
3 and drag racing. I just want to put that note out there,
4 just because we're in a task force does not mean we're
5 ending enforcement itself. With that, I don't know if you
6 watched the news last night, but late last night we had a
7 pursuit that initiated in City of Detroit, of an
8 individual who was wanting for a non-fatal shooting
9 earlier in that day.

10 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: But because of the safety of
11 individuals out there, the sergeant out there made the
12 conscious decision to call the pursuit off. However, a
13 helicopter was up. We followed this individual. He
14 actually went outside the city. I think he went down to
15 Monroe County. When he thought that the police were done
16 chasing him, he made the conscious decision to come back
17 to the city of Detroit. The helicopter was still
18 following him giving out the information. We waited until
19 he sat down at a certain location, and once he went into
20 the house, we did what we do. We conversed on that
21 location, got him locked up and arrested for that non-
22 fatal shoot. So, just great work by Detroit Police
23 Department. Smart work on some of the supervisors who
24 know that we had other assets out there that we could
25 utilize to get this individual into custody and not

1 endanger the public in involving a high pursuit.

2 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: As you mentioned Chairperson,
3 you talked about the promotional ceremonies that we just
4 had on past Monday were all ranks from detective all the
5 way up to my current position of AC were honored. I too
6 was surprised by the number of cars that I saw in the
7 parking lot. It was six o'clock at night, you would think
8 it would be filled at that capacity. But you were right.
9 It was standing room only. It was very nice to see a lot
10 of proud individuals, a lot of proud family members to
11 see their loved one getting promoted to the rank. A lot
12 of excitement in the Detroit Police Department right now.
13 If you don't know, the Board does not know the Chief has
14 announced that there is going to be another promotional
15 exam coming this year, and I believe it's in March. So
16 we're looking forward to those individuals taking the
17 test and getting promoted and taking over some of these
18 positions, even mine if I decide to get out of here
19 anytime soon.

20 COMMISSIONER: Yeah, we talked about that.

21 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: So let's talk about a couple
22 positive stories here. Shop with a hero. The 12th
23 Precinct holiday event happened Tuesday, December 20th.
24 The officers from the 12th Precinct took 20 children
25 shopping at Meijers ahead of the holiday. All had their

1 items paid for by participating officers. During the
2 holiday season, Detroit police officers love to give back
3 to the community ensuring that no one is left behind or
4 forgotten. Sergeant Santa, we had delivered gifts. The
5 News conference on Wednesday, December 21st. DPD's Chief
6 Neighborhood Liaison Office partnered with Detroit Public
7 Safety Foundation. They got together and they, again,
8 Sergeant Santa donation for Detroit families around the
9 city.

10 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: Following the news
11 conference, Chief White and several officers delivered
12 these gifts to local families. Again, very well received
13 by these families and it's really needed this time of
14 year. Today the Chief participated in another holiday
15 card giveaway they called Pay It Forward, where he, along
16 with some officers went up to 7 Mile and Conant, the
17 Belmont Shopping Center. In partnering with Forman Mills
18 and Imperial Fresh Market, they gave away several Visa
19 cards to community members who were shopping in that
20 area. So, again, that kind of concludes the report for
21 holiday season. Nice to see it end on such a great note.
22 From us and the Chief of Police, Detroit Police
23 department, we wish all of you are very happy holiday and
24 a safe new year.

25 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: Yes. I have one question. The

1 gentleman that put the gasoline on the ground, did you
2 guys catch him?

3 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: That's the one we got. That's
4 the one we followed, and we leveraged the technology. We
5 got him at the house. He's the one with the gun. Yes.

6 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: Awesome. Thank you.
7 Commissioner Banks.

8 COMMISSIONER BANKS: Yes. Through the Chair. Happy
9 Holidays season everyone, Board, staff those in the
10 audience and DPD. Assistant Chief, there was a gentleman
11 on the east side of Detroit, Conant and 7 Mile throughout
12 last weekend. He was a fake police officer pulling people
13 over. When he pulled people over, he would shoot them.
14 Now have they caught that crook yet? Has the crook been
15 caught yet?

16 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: I'm happy to report. We do
17 have him in custody.

18 COMMISSIONER BANKS: Okay. Wonderful. I got another
19 one. You mentioned that there's some great things coming
20 up in January. Is there any way you can give us a little
21 preview, a little sneak peek, a little glimpse of what's
22 coming forward in January?

23 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: We have several crime
24 initiatives that I want to really put out right now. We
25 don't want to give out the plan before we actually

1 initiate it. But I will tell you we're standing up our
2 CIT, our crisis intervention team. It will be on the
3 ground starting the first of this coming year. We have
4 currently 18 officers that we're going to be deploying.
5 We're looking to beat that up. We're going to have an
6 east side and west side response team. I believe that you
7 all saw the news conference where we talked about and we
8 produced what the vehicles look like, what the uniforms
9 will look like, and how we will proceed with that. Each
10 precinct will have CIT trained officers that will work in
11 constant with two districts. So, for instance, if the
12 officers are working the Fifth and Ninth Precinct, both
13 those precincts will respond to crisis interventions
14 runs. They'll be the first ones there to take over the
15 conversation with the individual and to try to get him or
16 her to calm down and actually get them some services that
17 they actually need.

18 COMMISSIONER BANKS: Okay.

19 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: We're looking forward to that
20 in January.

21 COMMISSIONER BANKS: Wonderful. Now, who said the 12
22 Precinct, they took 20 kids shopping. Was that the 12th
23 Precinct?

24 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: Yes. I believe that that's
25 for the 12th Precinct. Yes. So we had three events that

1 took place.

2 COMMISSIONER BANKS: Okay. One-

3 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: Now.

4 COMMISSIONER BANKS: Yes. Go ahead. I'm sorry,

5 Assistant Chief. Go ahead. No, go.

6 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: Of the other three, one was

7 the 12th Precinct, one was the Chief going out to shop

8 with Santa. What do we call that? I'm sorry.

9 COMMISSIONER HERNANDEZ: Sergeant Santa.

10 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: That one escaped me for a

11 second. Then also we had the giveaway of the gift cards

12 at the Belmont Shopping Center where he went up there and

13 gave out - I forgot what the total dollar amount of the

14 gift cards were, but he was up there for quite a while

15 giving out gift cards there.

16 COMMISSIONER BANKS: Okay. The officers and the

17 Chief, they're taking the people shopping and everything.

18 Now, did this come out of the officer's pocket, or it

19 came out of DPD's budget, or it came out of their pocket?

20 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: So the first one I mentioned,

21 you talked about the officers, that came out of their

22 pocket. They did that wonderful thing for those kids.

23 Now, right now, on the fourth floor, earlier today,

24 communications adopted a family of individuals who were a

25 victim of sexual assault. They brought those individuals

1 in and gave them a great Christmas up there on the fourth
2 floor. Mixed bread filled with a lot of food, a lot of
3 presents, and they were tremendously happy for the
4 generosity of those people up there on the fourth floor.

5 COMMISSIONER BANKS: Okay, wonderful. Now, DPD has a
6 budget for stuff like that too, also, right? Is that
7 correct?

8 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: I'm not going to call it a
9 budget. A lot of the goodness of the heart of some of our
10 officers, we do that. The Chief every year has something
11 that he does, which is like, again, the Sergeant Santa
12 and we have a lot of community members that want to
13 donate. So the gift cards at the Belmont Center was out
14 of the community, not the Detroit Police Department.

15 COMMISSIONER BANKS: Okay. I remember one year,
16 probably about three years ago, Chief Craig was giving
17 out a hundred dollars bills to people in the community.
18 So that was a blessing what DPD does. Thank God for DPD's
19 heart. That's a blessing to give back in this type of
20 season and this time of year. So that's what these
21 holiday season is about, giving back, to bring joy to
22 someone else. As you bring joy to someone else, God end
23 up giving you joy.

24 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: Yes, sir.

25 COMMISSIONER BANKS: I'm all set Chair. You were

1 saying?

2 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: Air forward.

3 COMMISSIONER BANKS: Right. I'm all set Chair.

4 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: Thank you. Commissioner Moore.

5 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Commissioner Banks took all my
6 questions.

7 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: Commissioner Hernandez.

8 COMMISSIONER BANKS: You got to be kidding.

9 COMMISSIONER HERNANDEZ: No questions. Just through
10 the Chair, a very brief comment of appreciation for the
11 hard work of the department, the entire team, and
12 appreciation for the times that we don't agree - which
13 happens a lot behind the scenes - and an appreciation for
14 continued progress in working together in 2023.

15 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: Okay. Commissioner Holley.

16 CHAIRPERSON HOLLEY: No questions. The same thing
17 that Commissioner Hernandez said, I'd like to echo that.
18 It's the sentiments exactly. Thank you so much.

19 ASSISTANT CHIEF EWING: Thank you, sir.

20 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: Mr. Brown.

21 MR. BROWN: Good afternoon, Mr. Chair, and this
22 honorable Board. We currently have five fives for oral
23 communication. I'll call those in the audience. Ms.
24 George, followed by Minister. Eric Blount, followed by
25 Overwith. Ms. George.

1 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: How are you doing Ms. George?

2 Wait one second. Hang on.

3 MS. GEORGE: Testing. Thank you. First of all,
4 through the Chair. Hello everyone, to the Board of Police
5 Commissioners, honorable Board. I do want to make a
6 comment in terms of the shooting of I think Mr. Burks on
7 the east side with all the shooting and all the bullets
8 with the police department because I do support the
9 police department. I know the state of Michigan
10 investigated, but that case should not have been. That
11 was too many bullets. It didn't take all of that. Now,
12 the bullets could have gone to those alligators that they
13 found in that house. But me being a member of National
14 Action Network and our stance on the police shootings and
15 citizens, that's something we disagree with. I disagree
16 with the state of police investigating that because there
17 should have been some charge. It didn't take all those
18 bullets.

19 MS. GEORGE: Because we, in New York, we have chime
20 bail those families that we represent. We want to say
21 that. On the other side, we do support the police
22 department. I went to the Second Police Precinct. We took
23 a dinner too because we know dealing with our officer
24 Loren Courts, we still support our officers. We took them
25 a dinner the other week. So I just want to make the

1 comment. How many minutes do I have, Mr. Brown? Let me
2 look at the time.

3 MR. BROWN: One minute.

4 MS. GEORGE: One minute. That was quick. One of the
5 things we are concerned with is they're putting a lot of
6 weed dispensaries in our community. I'm going to talk
7 with the mayor about this. With nurses, we get an off
8 day. We have to come out fighting. Look what meeting I
9 can go to. I'm off today. So the issue is that they're
10 trying to put a marijuana grower on one where we are
11 building a Joe Lewis Greenway project and we came out
12 fighting today. Absolutely not. I told them we're going
13 to pray as warriors, a spiritual fight when they come in
14 our community to grow marijuana growers. When I speak
15 with young people, we want our young people to become
16 officers, police, congressmen, nurses, doctors. So that's
17 something we're fighting for because our taxes are the
18 police department to fight that. So that's something. One
19 of the scriptures I did quote, what does it profit a man
20 to gain the whole world lose his soul? You're making
21 money off of people's brain cells. Do you know what I'm
22 saying? So Gideon had an army of 32,000 that God
23 shortened to 300. I told him, we are going to fight
24 spiritual warfare and make sure we pray them away. Thank
25 you.

1 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: Thank you.

2 COMMISSIONER BANKS: Good job. You got an army of
3 30,000 and he broke it down. There you go. He broke it
4 down to 300. But he had 30.

5 MR. BROWN: Mr. Chair, I don't see Minister. Eric
6 Blount. So we'll go with Overwith.

7 OVERWITH: Yeah. What's up Detroit and everybody out
8 there in earshot? This is Ruth. I'm totally out of the
9 bag now. In regard to case number 20-11-12. Chairman
10 Ferguson, I witnessed Acting Inspector Cromwell, Chief
11 Investigator Cromwell now, recommend to you that an
12 outside, independent outside law enforcement agency be
13 called in to investigate the murder, not suicide, murder
14 of Kaniesha Coleman. Now, her six-year-old daughter,
15 she's six now, but when she was five at the time when she
16 asked me, Mr. Rule, can you help me with my mama? Now
17 it's a couple days before Christmas. Chief White, Mayor
18 Mike Duggan, Stephanie Poe, Marco Pristoch, Derrick Maye,
19 Michael McGinnis, and Eric Decker, along with Jessica
20 Hunter and Jeffrey Hudson over at the Wayne County
21 Medical examiners know there was no gun stippling on the
22 entry wound so therefore the gun had to be so many feet
23 away from her.

24 OVERWITH: Kaniesha's arm was only so long so she
25 could have not fired the weapon herself that caused her

1 death and a demise. Now it is just totally ludicrous that
2 seasoned homicide detectives were pushed forth the
3 narrative, because right now her murder is classified as
4 a suicide by the Detroit Police Department - classified
5 label and tagged as a suicide. Nini wants the Detroit
6 Police Department to stop saying her mama killed herself.
7 That's her request. That's her wish. That's what she
8 asked me to help her with. So I'm going to do exactly
9 that. So I'm totally out the bag. Now, Christmas is a
10 couple days away. Can you all remove that tag off her
11 mother's case? Case number 20-11.

12 MR. BROWN: Mr. Chair, I don't see Mr. Maurice Cole,
13 nor do I see Mr. Sharon Davis, and he would've been your
14 last speaker.

15 CHAIRPERSON FERGUSON: All right. Thank you.
