Public Hearing on Policy Changes

ShotSpotter - Gunshot Detection System Policy 307.8

The Board first approved the Gunshot Detection System Policy in 2021 prior to DPD's ShotSpotter launch in the 8th and 9th Precincts to help address gun violence and crimes. This is the **first policy revision** since the system expanded to more areas to conduct audio surveillance for gunshots.

Officer-Involved Shooting (OIS) Investigations Policy 205.11

Previously covered in a use of force reporting/investigations policy, **OIS Investigations** is a **new directive** specifically dedicated to police duties and responsibilities in deadly force and other critical incidents, including when officers are victims. Recent fatal incidents, such as those involving Hakim Littleton, Nakita Williams, Kiaza Miller, Porter Burks, and Officer Loren Courts, have put Detroit in the spotlight for OIS Investigations.
