


#### We are the Community at the heart of Civil Rebellion and Creation of the Board of Police Commissioners

- Home to 12th and Clairmount
  - Site of the police raid that sparked the 1967 rebellion against widespread police racism and brutality
- Home to some of Detroit's first new housing/planned neighborhoods since post-WWI due to rebuilding after the rebellion
- Joseph Walker Williams Community Center opened in 1984 and was named for prominent leader of the era
- Detroit's likely only remaining police mini station is the 10<sup>th</sup> Precinct mini station (8675 Rosa Parks Boulevard)because the community fought to keep it
