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2	CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Good afternoon. It is now
3	three o'clock, and we will call this February 1st, 2024
4	Board of Police Commissioner's meeting to order. We'll
5	begin by a word of invocation which we'll receive from
6	Chaplain Angela Stallworth. Chaplain Stallworth.
7	CHAPLAIN STALLWORTH: Amen. Yes, I'm here.
8	CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Go right ahead.
9	CHAPLAIN STALLWORTH: You can hear me?
10	CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Yes.
11	CHAPLAIN STALLWORTH: Alright. Heavenly Father, we
12	thank you, Father, for being timely to be right on time.
13	God, I thank you for allowing us to come together today
14	to join in this auspicious occasion to discuss the
15	affairs of our city. First giving honor to my Lord and
16	Savior Jesus Christ, and to the new Police Commissioner
17	Darryl Woods, senior and the Board members in their
18	respective places. I thank you, Father, for allowing us
19	to once again meet, to attend to the affairs of the
20	citizens of this fine city and to serve and protect them,
21	Father. I'm asking that everything be done decent and in
22	order, and that in alignment with your will. Father, I'm
23	asking first that you will cover our police officers that
24	serve so diligently and faithfully in the affairs of our
25	city every day, Lord, that their interest and their



1	affairs would be considered. And I'm asking you, Lord,
2	that in all things that you would get all the glory, all
3	the honor and all the praise, and we just give you thanks
4	right now and consider everything done Jesus' name. Amen.
5	COMMISSIONERS: Amen.
6	CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Amen. Thank you so very much
7	for that prayer of invocation. And now, at this time,
8	we'll have the introduction of Commissioners by Mr.
9	Brown.
10	MR. BROWN: Chairperson QuanTez Pressley - Here.
11	MR. BROWN: Vice Chairperson Willie Bell - Present.
12	MR. BROWN: Commissioner Tamara Liberty Smith - Here.
13	MR. BROWN: Commissioner Linda Bernard - Attorney
14	Linda Bernard, District 2 - Present.
15	MR. BROWN: Commissioner Cedric Banks - Present.
16	MR. BROWN: Commissioner Willie Burton -
17	MR. BROWN: Commissioner Lisa Carter -
18	MR. BROWN: Commissioner Ricardo Moore - Present.
19	MR. BROWN: Commissioner Jesus Hernandez -

22	MR. BROWN: Mr. Chair, you have a quorum.
23	CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Thank you. We do indeed have a
24	quorum. And so now we'll move forward with your approval
25	of the February 1st, 2024 agenda. Is there any objection



to the agenda being approved? Hearing no objection. Those minutes, excuse me. The agenda is approved. And now we'll move on to the approval of the minutes for the January 25th, 2024 meeting. Is there any objection to these minutes? Hearing no objection, the minutes are also approved. I'll now move on to the introduction of BOPC

7 Staff, Chief of Police, Elected Officials,

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8 Representatives, and Community Leaders by Mr. Brown.

9 MR. BROWN: Good afternoon, Mr. Chair. Currently, we have Chief Investigator Jerome Warfield, Parliamentarian 10 Dr. Francis Jackson, Ms. Teresa Blossom, Ms. Jasmine 11 12 Taylor, Ms. Candace Underwood, Acting Supervisor 13 Investigator Elgin Murphy, American Sign Language 14 Interpreters, Dr. Stephanie Beatty and Ms. Yakada, DPD HR 15 Director Katrina Patillo. Mr. Don Handyside is our court 16 reporter, Cy is doing the video. And setting in for the 17 Chief is Deputy Chief Franklin Hayes. And for the Elected Official, Ms. Marie Overall, State Representative Tyrone 18 Carter's Office. Ms. LaDon Davis, City Council member of 19 Fred Durhal's Office, former Commissioner William Davis, 20 Ms. Freda Butler, Community Relations President of the 21 2nd Precinct, Mr. Ron Thomas, DPOA Vice President, and I 22 believe Ms. Sherri Wilder, DPOA Attorney. 23

24 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Alright, thank you. We're so 25 grateful everyone's attendance and are hoping that it



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adds the productivity of today's meeting. With that, we 1 now move on to the Board of Police Commissioner's 2 Officers report. And I'll just take this opportunity to 3 share with the public. As you can see on our agenda we do 4 have several closed sessions. And so that will require 5 for us to exit and enter the room on several occasions. 6 7 And so I just want to give you a heads up on that because it will feel inconvenient but it's necessary for us to 8 handle the matters of closed business. With that, is 9 there any other BOPC Officers report? Hearing none, we'll 10 move on to the Chief of Police Report where we have DC 11 12 Hayes. DC HAYES: Mr. Chair, thank you and good afternoon,

DC HAYES: Mr. Chair, thank you and good afternoon,excuse me, to this honorable body.

15 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: Microphone.

16 DC HAYES: Sorry, can you hear me now?

17 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Yes, go right ahead.

DC HAYES: Again Mr. Chair, good afternoon, and 18 certainly to this honorable body and those that are in 19 attendance, both in person as well as joining us 20 virtually. I am Franklin Hayes, Deputy Chief of our Crime 21 22 Strategies Bureau here in the Police Department, and I'd like to share with you what's going on here this week as 23 24 well as a roadmap for February here for the Police 25 Department. Currently, we have one member who is disabled



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and recovering at home from the 6th Precinct. As I
 looked, this member was, sorry, I'm trying to get my
 notes here together.

This member was injured while responding to shots in 4 5 progress run on the 12,000 block of Burt Road, where this 6 member sustained qunshot wounds. This member is 7 recovering in every effort to get back in the saddle, so 8 to speak, and return to service. So again, this member is 9 recovering but very promising, very optimistic that they will make a full recovery and join the ranks once again. 10 Sharing some statistical data. As of January 24th of this 11 12 year we continue a trend that we left off in last year, 13 which we were extremely proud of last year, but we know 14 our work isn't done. But staying on that trend our 15 homicides year to date, we are down 25%.

16 Last year, we had 20. This year we were at 15, 5 17 less homicides. Non-fatal shootings. We are down 21%. Last year we had 52. This year we had 41. Our robberies. 18 19 Last year we had 127. This year we had 89. So our total violent crime a 9% reduction. Last year, we had 913 20 21 incidents. This year, we are at 832. Lastly, carjacking. We are at 33% reduction. There were 18 carjackings this 22 23 time last year. This year we are at 12. Again, so 24 certainly with the strategy that is, excuse me, strategy 25 that is extremely comprehensive, where we take both a



1 micro look at crime that's going on in addition to the 2 macro, to look at specific areas, and with our deployment and work of the community, we know we cannot do this by 3 4 ourselves. But we are again, very proud of the numbers 5 year to date with this violent trend going favorably and 6 a reduction. Our mental health-related calls, year to 7 date we are at again, 5 categories, where it's mental, nonviolent, mental violent armed, mental violent not 8 9 armed, our suicide and progress, and our suicide threats. For service calls, last year we had 1,198. This year 10 we are at 1095. So we have partnerships with our mental 11 12 health co-response as well as community stakeholders that 13 understands that this is not a crime. Mental health is 14 not a crime, and we cannot arrest our way out of it. And 15 handcuffs are not the remedy. So working in getting 16 those, the help that they need these numbers are 17 promising. Overdose-related calls, either overdose or one down. Last year we had 371. This year we had three 30. 18 19 So, again, with those partnerships that we're working 20 with collectively, we are seeing reductions that we are 21 extremely proud of. And we hope that this trend continues. Just to share some significant events. A 22 23 homicide that happened on January 25th at 11:00 PM where officers responded to the 18,000 block of Kelly on a call 24 for service of a homicide. 25



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When officers arrived to the scene they observed the 1 victim in the kitchen suffering several gunshot wounds to 2 the body. The officers rendered medical aid and 3 assistance until the medics got there. He was transported 4 to St. John's Hospital where the victim succumbed to his 5 injuries. Detectives that got the victim understand, I'm 6 sorry. The detective discovered that the victim got into 7 an argument with one of the witnesses at the scene who is 8 9 the mother of his child, the suspect who is the witness's brother arrived at the scene and began to argue. The 10 suspect, shot the victim, and then left the location and 11 12 fled. This suspect has not been apprehended. But anyone with the information, with this homicide that occurred in 13 14 the 18,000 block of Kelly, we are urging you and asking 15 you pleading with you to bring this family closure and 16 certainly accountability to this person for his actions 17 by calling 1800 SpeakUp at Crime Stoppers, Detroit Rewards TV, as well as Detroit Police Homicide. A 18 carjacking that occurred on February 26th (Sic?) in the 19 11,000 block of East Seven Mile, where officers spoke to 20 the victim who stated that he and the suspect were in a 21 22 2005 Ford Escape, when they began to argue. 23 The victim states, the suspect struck him 7 to 8

23 The victim states, the suspect struck him 7 to 8
24 times in the face, threw him out the vehicle, and drove
25 off eastbound on Seven Mile. The victim received facial



1 injuries as a result of the attack, and medics transported our victim to the hospital where officers 2 from the 9th Precinct, well from that point, the 3 investigation began. Officers from the Precinct held the 4 scene, and detectives from our commercial auto theft were 5 notified and responded. The victim's vehicle was 6 discovered in the 10,000 block of West Seven Mile. The 7 detectives have identified and are currently searching 8 9 for the suspect and asking anyone with any additional 10 information, again, to please contact Crime Stoppers at 1800 SpeakUp Detroit, Rewards TV, as well. I want to skip 11 12 down to a missing person's investigation that occurred January 27th of this year in the 15000 block of Wildemere 13 on a call for a missing person, possibly shot. 14

15 Officers arrived at the scene to check the area for a person possibly shot at the location. Officers were 16 unable to locate a victim at this time. However, officers 17 discovered evidence that the shooting may have occurred 18 at that location. While at the scene, family members 19 arrived and stated to the officers that they had received 20 a phone call stating that their relative had been shot 21 earlier that day at that location. Officers canvased the 22 area and have been unable to locate the victim. However, 23 24 the victim's vehicle was discovered, burned in the 1700 block of West Grand Boulevard later that day. Detectives 25



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1 from the Missing Persons Unit responded to the scene and are leading this investigation. At this time, the victim 2 has not been found, and this investigation is ongoing. As 3 recent as today, in various areas throughout the city, we 4 5 are conducting searches with officers that just got out 6 of the Academy. And it's possible as this search expands 7 to bring this family closure. You may see Academy students out as well, combing the areas that our 8 9 technology, we have those investigative leads to possibly recover this person's remains, if not save their life, if 10 they're being held captive. So more to come. We will 11 12 certainly keep you updated as to this investigation. But 13 anyone with any additional information, please contact 14 Crime Stoppers at 1800, SpeakUp as, well as Rewards TV. 15 Just three things in the community. Our business 16 community Comstat meeting occurred Tuesday, January 30th, where the 11th Precinct held their Precinct business, 17 community Comstat. This meeting allowed for businesses to 18 address concerns and challenges, learn about our crime 19 stats, as well as crime prevention, and build 20 relationships with their Precinct officers. 21 So certainly we work with our community but also to 22

22 our corporate stakeholders to have relationships with 24 them as well in our various Precincts and throughout the 25 city. Also on Tuesday at the Charles A. Wright Museum,



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1 our DPD Explorers and our Explorers Advisors went to Charles A. Wright Museum to film content for Black 2 History Month. The content will be shared on DPD social 3 media page throughout the month of February. And on 4 5 Wednesday, the 6th Precinct hosted their monthly community meetings for local citizens to attend on today 6 the 10th, as well as the 9th, Precincts will be holding 7 their monthly community meetings as well. That completes 8 my report, but at this time I would like to certainly 9 turn this over, and I will relinquish this sheet to Chief 10 White. 11 12 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Okay, great. 13 DC HAYES: Thank you. 14 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: And are there any questions 15 for the Chief, on the Chief's report? 16 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: Just a comment. 17 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Commissioner Bernard. COMMISSIONER BERNARD: Thank you for an excellent 18 19 report, Deputy Chief Hayes. I'd also like to say that I congratulate our community and the community 20 organizations and the Board members that work so 21 intensely with community organizations. It is a victory 22 for us all that there's been 9%, I think you said, 23 24 reduction in crime, but as I say all the time, that means the community is standing down. That means the community 25



1 is making, as you say Chief, better choices in terms of 2 the things to do. So, I want to congratulate the people 3 of the City of Detroit for this reduction in crime, as 4 well as law enforcement. Also I noticed in the package of 5 notices that we got from you, that there is going to be a 6 de-escalation training by Wayne State University Law 7 enforcement for our officers.

I'm concerned, however, and I think that's a great 8 idea. It's a two-day training, but I concerned that it's 9 limited, I think, to 15 officers. We have a Department of 10 more than 2000. I would like to think that all of our 11 12 officers might be able to benefit whatever they're doing, 13 whether they're on the street or not, from this 14 particular training. So I'd simply request that you look 15 into that if you can, or you can rotate them, you know, 16 15 now, 15, whatever. But I just think a two-day training 17 at the university is a great idea. Thank you.

CHIEF WHITE: Thank you. And through the Chair, 18 regarding the de-escalation training as the Board is 19 aware, we do a comprehensive de-escalation training 20 segment in our Academy, as well as our 40-hour training 21 that is annual. And we also have a robust policy around 22 de-escalation. We took this opportunity with Wayne 23 24 State's de-escalation training to see if it's anything 25 new that we can learn from, we're sending this first



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1 group if we are able to. If it's better than what we're 2 doing, if it's more advanced. And then we'll be incorporating it department-wide, and you'll see a 3 4 trainer, trainer segment for our officers. 5 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: Okay. Thank you. 6 CHIEF WHITE: I would also, if I may, very briefly, just briefly this body on what you may have heard about 7 8 with regards to DDOT and the potential of us taking 9 over... 10 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Go right ahead. 11 CHIEF WHITE: ...make you're aware, and I'll do so 12 very briefly. We are exploring the return of policing 13 responsibilities for the DDOT transportation system, the 14 DPD responding to requests, guite frankly, from the 15 community, as well as some of the drivers as it relates 16 to safety and security on the bus system. This move 17 responds to that request, as well as returns us to where 18 we were many, many years ago with those services. As of 19 right now, the people mover police will be intact. There's no conversation regarding them not providing that 20 21 service. They will do what they do best. As it relates to the DDOT, the drivers, we would look at taking over those 22 services later this year. 23 24 There's roughly a 5 to \$7 million budget that we are

25 going through right now. And looking at, we anticipate



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about 50 to 70 police officers at DPD dedicated to 1 2 protecting the transportation system. As of now, we are exploring all options, including those members that are 3 currently assigned to Transit getting opportunities with 4 5 the Detroit Police Department, those that fall within the opportunities that are provided by the Department with 6 regards to the rules, regulations, as well as the NACOLES 7 standards. And so that's where we're at. I look forward 8 to briefing this body when we have more information, but 9 you've probably heard some conversation at the very least 10 about us in that process. 11

12 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Alright. Thank you. Any 13 further comments with the Chief? Commissioner Moore? 14 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Chief, 15 drug testing. The late great Ron Scott, Coalition of 16 Police Against Police Brutality always advocated for drug testing to take place after a critical incident. Is there 17 any conversation about that, now, considering marijuana, 18 alcohol for all practical purposes is more common now 19 amongst our members? 20

21 CHIEF WHITE: Through the Chair, no conversation on 22 critical incident drug testing. We are still 23 participating in random drug testing of our members, 24 though.

25 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Okay. And my second question is



one photo lineups. The Policy Committee was looking at the policy that you submitted to us, and it didn't mention anything about one photo lineups. And I was wondering, is that a practice, a common practice that DPD uses? And if not, how come it wasn't in the policy? CHIEF WHITE: Through the Chair. Just for point of

7 clarification, one photo lineup.

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8 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Yeah. Not the 6-pack, but the 9 one photo lineup. Are you familiar with that?

CHIEF WHITE: I'm familiar with it. And we're 10 11 prohibit they're prohibited. Our new policy requires, at 12 minimum, a 6-pack, and it's a blind draw. And in fact, 13 we've made the policy even more extensive. And this was in light of some issues we discovered that this Board is 14 15 aware of regarding what actually led to a false 16 identification. So now it's a double blind draw, which 17 means the investigator who knows the perpetrator and 18 knows who he or she suspects for the crime does not 19 participate in the 6-pack. The blind draw would be another investigator conducts the 6- pack and shows the 20 photos to the victim to not bias the review of the photos 21 22 and do anything to urge who, one may think is the suspect to the victim. We think it's cleaner that way, and that's 23 24 why you did not see a single photo in that policy.

25 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Follow up with a conversation



1 with Commander Parish.

2 CHIEF WHITE: Thank you.

3 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Alright. Thank you. Any 4 further questions? I'm going to come back. Commissioner 5 Banks. Let the record reflect, we have been joined by 6 Commissioner Burton. Go, go right ahead.

COMMISSIONER BANKS: Alright. Thank you. Through the8 Chair. Chief blessings to you and your household.

9 CHIEF WHITE: Thank you.

10 COMMISSIONER BANKS: You are welcome. 25% reduction

11 in the homicide, is that right? Did I hear that right,

12 25%?

13 CHIEF WHITE: It's early, but yes, sir.

14 COMMISSIONER BANKS: That's incredible. That's solid. 15 Also on February the 28th, we are having the Citizens 16 Complaint Committee. Aric Ewing is normally there. I 17 mean, Assistant Chief Ewing is normally there with us in 18 that meeting, every time we have one. Chief, is there any 19 way we can get NPO out also, because I would like to have 20 an NPO out. Can you help us?

21 CHIEF WHITE: Done.

22 COMMISSIONER BANKS: Wonderful.

23 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Right. Commissioner Bernard

24 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: Just real quickly. In the 25 packet Chief, there's a notice about tow fees and the new



1 process that you have where there's an accident, DPD is 2 to respond and a DPD tower. And if the person, I guess, doesn't want the DPD tower, then they have to sign a form 3 or something saying, we let you take your own car with a 4 5 tower of your choice. My question is, just to make sure, because we've had so many complaints, and you're aware of 6 7 them about community tourers or whatever you want, 8 private towers, community is the wrong word. Private 9 towers, sort of ripping off Detroiters and other people who are in Detroit with both the tow fee as well as the 10 overnight storage fee and stuff. Are all of the towers 11 12 that will be towing by police mandated to have a certain 13 fee for the actual toll and a certain fee for the storage 14 that is, if you will, community friendly? CHIEF WHITE: Well, I don't know how we would define 15 16 community friendly, but I will say that we have a set tow 17 fee that's part of the policy as well as part of their contract. And the storage fees are controlled by that 18 same contract on City of Detroit approved tours, 19 including DPD. 20

21 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: Yes, sir. Okay. If you could 22 look at that when you get a chance and see what those 23 fees are, just let us know, because we get these 24 complaints as you know, right in this room frequently, 25 yeah.



CHIEF WHITE: I'll provide this body with... our
 tows.

3 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: I know you can't tell me about4 the private guys.

CHIEF WHITE: I'll provide you all with a copy of the 5 policy regarding that. And that's where that rule that 6 7 you're referencing came out of. We had citizens who were 8 being charged exorbitant fees for tows, and they thought 9 they were using City of Detroit approved tows, or the City of Detroit's Towing Unit. And we found that there 10 11 are literally some tows that are following the accident 12 calls and saying, I'll tow your car. And they thought it 13 was a city tow. So that's why they have to do the release 14 at the scene.

15 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: Thank you. That's a good 16 policy.

17 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Okay. Any other comments?18 Commissioner Banks?

19 COMMISSIONER BANKS: This is going to be real quick, 20 Mr. Chair. Chief, haven't seen you in a while. How your 21 wellbeing been doing. I haven't seen you in a little 22 while. I'm am just checking on your wellbeing.

23 CHIEF WHITE: Thank you for asking, sir. I'm hanging24 in there.

25 COMMISSIONER BANKS: Okay, good.



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1 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Alright. Excellent. And so, as 2 you can see that there are some extra attendees at today's meeting. And just so that we all are aware, again 3 we did receive information from DPD at the end of last 4 5 week relative to some promotions. However, when we noted that there were 5 closed sessions, we initially scheduled 6 to have that conversation about the promotions next week. 7 Okay? So that's why you didn't see it in your packets 8 with your agenda. But after speaking to DPD, and my 9 understanding, that Chief White will be out of the 10 11 country next week.

12 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: I want to go.

CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: There was a desire that we 13 14 would handle those today. And so you did receive that 15 through email, but I will leave to my colleagues your 16 comfort level in handling that today versus waiting to next week. If by chance, we end up waiting to next week 17 we then can still get Chief White's comments on the 18 record regarding these promotions. But I'll leave it up 19 to the will of my colleagues. And so the chair entertains 20 a motion. Would that be to suspend the rules to add that 21 22 to the meeting, or ...?

DR. JACKSON: We would have to move to suspend the rules. It's a non-debatable motion. It requires twothirds to be adopted.



1 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Okay. So the Chair entertains

2 a motion to suspend the rules...

3 COMMISSIONER WOODS: So moved.

4 DR. JACKSON: And amend the agenda.

5 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: To suspend the rules and amend 6 the agenda.

7 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: So moved.

8 COMMISSIONER WOODS: Second.

9 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: It's been properly moved and 10 second. All those in favor? Oh, it says two-thirds. So we

11 need a roll call vote.

12 DR. JACKSON: Yes, sir.

13 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Yes. Mr. Brown.

14 MR. BROWN: Chairperson Pressley - Yes.

- 15 MR. BROWN: Vice Chairperson Bell Yes.
- 16 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Smith Yes.
- 17 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Bernard Yes.
- 18 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Banks Yes.
- 19 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Burton No.
- 20 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Carter -
- 21 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Moore Yes.
- 22 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Hernandez -
- 23 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Gamble -
- 24 MR. BROWN: Commissioner Woods Yes.
- 25 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Alright. So, 7 yes votes, 1 no



1 vote. That motion passes. And so that's just to suspend 2 the rules. So now, do we need a motion to actually handle 3 the promotions at that...

4 DR. JACKSON: Suspend the rules and amend the agenda 5 by adding this item. It is all one motion, sir.

6 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Okay. So that's done then?
7 DR. JACKSON: Yes, sir.

CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Okay. And so we can handle the 8 matter of promotions. And so Chief White, it's on you. 9 CHIEF WHITE: Well let me first start off by thanking 10 this honorable body for taking this up. The reason that I 11 12 asked because I know there wasn't a lot of homework with 13 these candidates. These are really strong candidates' 14 good backgrounds, no significant number of citizens' complaints. I'm not going to be testifying on anything 15 16 other than the fact that they are ready for promotion. 17 I'll start with Lieutenant Erica Frederick was appointed to the Detroit Police Department on May 27th, 2003 as a 18 police officer. Lieutenant Frederick was assigned to the 19 13th Precinct, or I'm sorry, the 13th Patrol Operations 20 Precinct after completing the Detroit Metropolitan Police 21 Academy. And that's what it was called at that time. 22 During her tenure as an officer, she worked Patrol, 23 Special Operations, Central District, Northeastern 24 District and the 10th Precinct. In addition to Patrol 25



Operations, she was also assigned to the Vice Enforcement
 Unit.

On December 19th, 2016, Lieutenant Frederick was 3 promoted to the rank of sergeant and was assigned to the 4 5 5th Precinct. While assigned to the 5th Precinct, she was 6 appointed to the rank of Master Sergeant. Additionally, she served in the Training Academy. And also I want to 7 just state that she worked under Assistant Chief Aric 8 9 Ewing, where she did a phenomenal job and he mentored her in her role. On December 20th, 2022, Lieutenant Frederick 10 was appointed by this body to Lieutenant and assigned as 11 12 the Officer in Charge of our Force Investigation Unit. 13 Lieutenant Frederick is a graduate of Cleary University 14 with a Bachelor of Business Administration and Leadership 15 and Diversity, as well as Public Safety. Lieutenant 16 Frederick has expertise in areas of active shooter, 17 tactical techniques, incident command systems, advanced vice and narcotics training, technical medical first aid, 18 critical incident containment, dignitary protection, 19 cultural awareness and sensitivity, emotional survival 20 for law enforcement officer and officer survival tactics 21 22 as an instructor who develops other members of the 23 Department, has done a phenomenal job serving at our Force Investigation Units. And she also presents at our 24 officer involved shootings and critical incidents 25



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1 involving officers' use of force. Professional,

2 dedicated, and ready to lead proudly. I recommend her for

3 the position of captain.

4 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Question, Mr. Chairman.

5 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Commissioner Moore.

6 COMMISSIONER MOORE: So, Chief, I have a captain 7 that's bouncing between the 6th Precinct and the 10th 8 Precinct.

9 CHIEF WHITE: I knew you were going to say that. I'm going to tell you about that. So we have commander, now 10 Commander Starks, who is in the FBI Academy. So that left 11 12 a pretty big hole at number 10. Unfortunately, we had an 13 incident involving a command officer that I had to take immediate action on and relieve of that command and duty 14 15 of captain, which gave us 2 openings at that assignment. 16 And so in doing so, I sent a captain over there to assist 17 Commander Amarado who's our Management Services Commander, who's doing a good job at number 10, I might 18 add, to hold it down until Commander Starks comes back 19 from FBI Academy, Starks will be returning to the 10th 20 Precinct, but upon her arrival, she will meet her new 21 captain who's in this room right now, should this Board 22 23 approve it?

24 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Who might that be?25 CHIEF WHITE: Well, if you approve it. That's going



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1 to be Lieutenant Shannon Hampton.

CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Alright. Is Lieutenant
Frederick here? Okay. Just so we can see you. Excellent.
Okay. Go right ahead. Can you all switch your name
plates?

6 COMMISSIONER WOODS: Okay. Yeah.

7 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Confuse me there for a minute. COMMISSIONER WOODS: She thinks she may. We are not 8 behind the 8th ball on this Chief. We did our homework on 9 these, and it was, you know, we did a deep dive. We got 10 the information from our team, and we was able to 11 12 research the background. And I say that they do have stellar backgrounds. And so I'm definitely here to 13 support this without question. But we are doing our due 14 15 diligence and we long as you read, you know, we can be 16 able to get the answers that we need. And I think we have 17 some good product here.

18 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Okay. So the Chair entertains 19 the motion to accept the Chief's recommendation to 20 promote Lieutenant Erica Frederick to the rank of 21 captain.

22 COMMISSIONER WOODS: So move.

23 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Is there a second?

24 COMMISSIONER BANKS: Second.

25 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: It's been properly moved and

1 second. Any discussion?

2 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Discussion, Mr. Chairman.

3 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Commissioner Burton.

COMMISSIONER BURTON: Mr. Chairman this information, 4 5 all of this information about appointments just came to the Board as of late last night. The Board really have 6 7 not had the opportunity to really go through all of the 8 promotions, you know, so I like to really amend that we 9 postpone this to the following week so we can have our due diligence to really exercise our fiduciary 10 responsibility by looking at each one of these 11

12 promotions.

DR. JACKSON: The motion needs a second. The motionto postpone, we'll need a second.

15 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Is this to postpone it until 16 next week? Mr. Chair, this information came in late last 17 night.

18 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: The Chair here is no second, 19 so there is no amendment to the motion. Is there any 20 further discussion?

21 COMMISSIONER WOODS: Again, I would just emphasize 22 that once the information got to me, got to my desk I 23 read and I made phone calls, I made inquiries. And based 24 upon that, I did a deep dive. Like I would trust that all 25 of other Board members have done the same. And so I would



1 say I'm ready to move forward with this.

2 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Okay. Any further discussion? 3 Hearing none, again, the motion is to accept the Chief's 4 recommendation to promote Lieutenant Erica Frederick to 5 the rank of captain. All those in favor, please signify 6 by saying, aye.

7 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

8 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: All those who oppose, no?

9 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Abstain.

10 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: The ayes have it.

11 Congratulations.

12 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: She's present?

CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Yeah, she's right at the 13 14 microphone. And you could briefly share some remarks. 15 CAPTAIN FREDERICK: Thank you, to this Board. I would 16 like to thank the Chief and the Executive Team for trusting me in this new leadership role. And I'd like 17 stand ready to serve the citizens of the City of Detroit. 18 So thank you to the Board. Thank you to the Chief. Also, 19 I want to thank my mentors, just to name a few. Assistant 20 Chief Aric Ewing, DC Sloan, Commander Sonia Russell. My 21 friends that are in the room that have always supported 2.2 me throughout my career, my family that's watching back 23 home. Thank you all. 24

25 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Congratulations to Captain



1 Frederick. Chief, your next recommendation.

CHIEF WHITE: Next recommendation, Lieutenant Shannon 2 Hampton. Lieutenant Shannon Hampton was appointed to the 3 Detroit Police Department on June 11th, 2001. As a police 4 officer, Lieutenant Hampton was assigned to the 4th 5 Precinct, Patrol Operations. During her tenure as an 6 officer, she worked Patrol Operations for the second 7 Precinct in the Southwest District. In addition to 8 9 investigative operations, she was assigned to Organize Crime Unit, Criminal Investigations, Headquarters 10 Surveillance, and Internal Control Operations. On 11 12 November 25th, 2013, Lieutenant Hampton was promoted to 13 the rank of Sergeant and was assigned to Force 14 Investigation Unit. Additionally, she served in the 15 Public Corruption Integrity Unit and then later returning 16 to the Force Investigation Unit. Her other experiences include working in the Office of Civil Rights and 17 Planning, Research and Deployment under Special 18 Operation, or Support Operations, excuse me. It is 19 through her work in the Public Corruption Integrity Unit 20 and Support Operations and Planning and Research 21 Development, Lieutenant Hampton has acquired valuable 22 leadership and supervisory experience. 23

24 On June 29th, 2020, Lieutenant Hampton was promoted 25 by dishonorable body to lieutenant and assigned as the



1 Officer in Charge of the Force Investigation Unit. 2 Additionally, Lieutenant Hampton served as the Officer in Charge of police law. Lieutenant Hampton is currently 3 assigned to the Management Services Section. Lieutenant 4 5 Hampton holds a Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice, a master's of science and Administration of Justice and 6 Security, and a graduate certificate in Business 7 Administration from Wayne State University. Lieutenant 8 9 Hampton has an extensive background in leadership. And just as an added point for this body during Covid in 2020 10 when it first hit Lieutenant Hampton was instrumental in 11 12 helping stabilize this agency. We didn't know what the 13 heck we were going to do when we had so many members 14 going down with Covid. So we had to set up a Covid 15 response unit very quickly. She was one of 3 people 16 assigned to it to help get people to the hospital and get 17 services delivered to them, get PPE to them. And she did so with distinction and leadership, while fighting, 18 oftentimes through COVID herself. So very thankful to 19 have her on the team. Very proud to recommend her as 20 captain. And she's going to do a great job at the 10th 21 Precinct with her commander. 22

CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Thank you. The Chair
entertains a motion to accept the Chief's recommendation
to promote, to, excuse me, to promote Lieutenant Shannon



1 Hampton to the rank of captain.

2 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: So moved.

3 COMMISSIONER HERNANDEZ: Support.

4 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: It's been properly moved and 5 second. Is there any discussion?

6 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Discussion, Mr. Chairman.

7 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Commissioner Burton.

COMMISSIONER BURTON: Mr. Chairman, once again we 8 9 must not rubber stamp any of these promotions today. We just got this information late last night. We have not 10 had opportunity to raise questions with our staff. We 11 12 have been down this road before where this Board has 13 approved promotions, and it came back to backfire against 14 this Board. I'm not saying that we don't have good 15 applicants or candidates up here today for promotion. But 16 what I am saying is that the Chief had to have known at 17 some time that he wanted to promote his officers to these different ranks. We have not had the same due diligence 18 19 to really weigh in on these promotions. I mean it would've been nice if we could have had a week at best, 20 but to do this today and this information came in last 21 22 night, and we have not got a chance to really sit down with our staff, and raise questions. It is preposterous. 23 And that's the reason why, you know, I made the motion to 24 25 amend the motion so we can postpone this to the following



week. It would've been nice to have gotten a second from
 one of my colleagues today.

3 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: It's reasonable, but just to be clear, again, the Department did send the information 4 5 last week. We held it again because I didn't think that we would have time to do it this week. So it was sent out 6 yesterday from our staff, but they did do their due 7 diligence. And I'm confident that our colleagues have 8 done the same. I know that I have. I know that it has 9 been stated that it's been done. And if you had an 10 opportunity to peruse through the emails, again, you'll 11 12 see that there's not many questions that'll be raised 13 from their exemplary track records. And so, again, it is 14 within your right to vote no. And that is reasonable to 15 do. Commissioner Moore, I mean, excuse me, Commissioner 16 Woods.

17 COMMISSIONER WOODS: That's my cousin.

18 COMMISSIONER WOODS: I had an opportunity to question. I called Mr. Brown late last night, as of late 19 last night, talk to him throughout the process to be able 20 to make sure that we had all the information. Our team 21 22 got us, all of the complaints that they may have had or any of the things that they possibly could have went 23 through. So it was a deep dive into this matter. And so 24 25 based upon that there's no rubber stamp here because if



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1 there's some red flags, you know, we definitely would have saw that and would've heard that. And then you also 2 have to look at, you know this Board brought the Chief in 3 and the Chief needs a team to be able to help continue to 4 reduce the crime in this city. And so I have confidence 5 in this Chief, and I think this Board has confidence in 6 this Chief to do his job. So based upon that I'm ready to 7 roll. 8

9 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Okay. Any further discussion?
 10 COMMISSIONER SMITH: Yes, sir.

11 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Yes. Commissioner Smith.

12 COMMISSIONER SMITH: Yes. Through the Chair. I 13 believe that I received my email in a timely manner. Even 14 speaking with some of my colleagues yesterday, 15 overviewing the emails. Some of the officers I do know 16 personally, and I do support the Chief and his 17 recommendation. The officers that we've supported in the past have been great, and I believe these will be as 18 19 well.

20 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Thank you. Any further 21 discussion? Hearing none, again, the motion on the floor 22 is to accept the Chief's recommendation to promote 23 Lieutenant Shannon Hampton to the rank of Captain. All 24 those in favor, please signify by saying, aye. 25 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.



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1 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: All those opposed, no?

2 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Abstain.

3 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: The ayes have it.

4 Congratulations.

5 CAPTAIN HAMPTON: Through the Chair. I'd like to 6 thank this honorable Board for this opportunity, to the 7 Chief and the Executive Staff here at DPD and all of 8 those who have supported me throughout my 22 years here. 9 I look forward to this opportunity to serve the community 10 at the 10th Precinct. And I look forward to doing great 11 things. Thank you.

12 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Thank you. Go right ahead13 Chief.

14 CHIEF WHITE: The next is going to be Lieutenant Dana 15 Russell and she's not here. I just was informed, she's 16 unfortunately at home sick. She wanted to be here and she 17 wanted you to connect a name with a face. Many of you may 18 already know her. Lieutenant Dana Russell was appointed to the Detroit Police Department on June 24th, 1996. As a 19 police officer, Lieutenant Russell was assigned to the 20 9th Precinct Patrol Operations. During her tenure as an 21 officer, she worked in Patrol Special Operations. Officer 22 Russell gained investigative experience as a member of 23 24 the Commercial Auto Theft Unit, Investigative Operations 25 and Armed Robbery Home Invasion Unit. She is a dynamo. On



1 December 19th, 2016, Lieutenant Russell was promoted by this honorable body to sergeant, and she was put in 2 charge once again of the Commercial Auto Theft Unit. 3 There's a common theme here with that. 4 5 In addition, she was assigned to Headquarters Surveillance Transit Team where she was responsible for 6 managing the daily operations of Headquarters 7 Surveillance and ensuring proper conduct, appearance, 8 discipline, training of the subordinates there. On 9 January 14th, 2024 once again, Lieutenant Russell was 10 appointed by this honorable Body to Lieutenant and 11 12 assigned to Organized Crime Unit where she served as the 13 Officer in Charge of the Commercial Auto Theft Unit. And 14 her responsibilities, she managed and supervised sworn 15 and non-sworn staff, prepared reports and auto theft 16 statistics, developed strategies and conducted numerous 17 operations aimed at reducing auto theft and work collaboratively and closely with other units throughout 18 the Department. Lieutenant Russell holds a master's 19 degree in Administration of Justice and Security. Let me 20 do that again. She holds a Master's degree in 21 Administration of Justice and Security, and a Bachelor's 22 degree in Criminal Justice Administration, both from the 23 24 University of Phoenix.

25 Through her distinguished career, Lieutenant Russell



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has earned numerous accolades, including the 9th Precinct 1 Officer of the Year, and the Spirit of Detroit Award, the 2 Chief's Merit Award and outstanding police service, and 3 4 citations throughout the Department. Just one additional point about Lieutenant Russell. She has run our 5 6 Commercial Auto Theft Unit most recently, has done just 7 an amazing job. She took over that unit. We were up in carjackings, which is her focus. Her comprehensive 8 approach, detail orientation and using the data to tell 9 her where to assign her officers and how to address this. 10 We closed out the year for the first time in many, many 11 12 years. And I think this is the highest reduction, but 13 please don't hold me to that because I have not checked 14 that stat.

15 But I know it's been years with a 34% reduction in 16 carjackings in the City of Detroit. And it's directly 17 attributed to the plans and processes that she put in place under the leadership of her boss, Deputy Chief 18 Sloan, and her team over at Commercial Auto Theft could 19 not be prouder to recommend her as a captain in our 20 21 Department. Her assignment will be Downtown Services. She's going to go down there. She's going to address a 22 23 lot of the theft, auto thefts and, and robberies and 24 things such as that. And we're excited to have her take 25 that assignment.



1 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Okay. The Chair entertains a 2 motion to accept the Chief's recommendation to promote 3 Lieutenant Dana Russell to the rank of Captain.

4 COMMISSIONER MOORE: So moved.

5 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: Second.

6 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: It's been properly moved and 7 second. Any discussion?

8 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Mr. Chairman.

9 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Commissioner Bernard.

COMMISSIONER BERNARD: Just briefly, Chief. I'm very 10 happy to hear about the reduction obviously in auto 11 12 theft, if you will, and certainly carjacking. But my 13 question to you was when she did this investigation and 14 put this team together, did you discover that this was 15 done by one group of people or was this just random, just 16 kids deciding they want to ride from point A to point B? Was it a thing? 17

CHIEF WHITE: Yes, it was both. It was organized. And 18 I mean, we're still disrupting a lot of it. We had the 19 Care kids that were learning from YouTube, how to steal 20 21 kids (Sic). We had, and unfortunately, because I just 22 said that's probably going to happen a little more now. 23 But we also had some more sophisticated theft issues. And we're not declaring victory, we're nowhere near done. But 24 25 I have been impressed with her approach her relentless



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1 pursuit of those who break the law and steal cars and 2 carjack folks in our community. And to take that and 3 expand it out in an area where it's much needed. It's 4 exciting.

5 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: Thank you.

6 COMMISSIONER BURTON: To the Chair.

7 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Commissioner Burton.

8 COMMISSIONER BURTON: You know, I'd like to raise a 9 question to our Acting Secretary, Robert Brown. Question 10 for Mr. Robert Brown is what timeframe do the Board 11 normally take on when we review each one of these line 12 items, when it comes to promotions? And did we fall 13 within that timeframe, this go along, knowing that an 14 email just went out yesterday?

MR. BROWN: Through the Chair. Commissioner Burton, the report is called the Chairperson Report. And anytime he deems that he wants something on that report, whether it's today or tomorrow, we then have to put that on the report because it's his report.

20 COMMISSIONER BURTON: And so that answered my 21 question right there. I mean, did this Chairperson put 22 this on a report today for the Board meeting, but we 23 haven't done our research. We haven't gone through these 24 promotions. This Board has passed promotions before in 25 the past and have not gone through these. We have not sat



1 down with our staff. We have not even communicated with
2 each other about this, you know, and so...

3 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Let the record reflect that 4 that's a generous use of the word, "We," as has been 5 communicated by Commissioners that their due diligence 6 has been done. Questions have been asked...

7 COMMISSIONER BURTON: This was sent out yesterday, Mr. Chairman, it was sent out yesterday. So this was sent 8 9 out yesterday evening and we voting on this matter today. This is preposterous. This is rubber stamping promotions. 10 I'm not saying that we don't have good candidates right 11 12 here. I'm not saying that at all. It's the timing that 13 matters. It's the timing that's important. We talk about our citizens of Detroit. We talk about promoting new you 14 15 know, people to new positions. We haven't vet any of 16 this. This is straight up rubber stamping, like usual. We 17 need to stop that

18 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Again, that is a very 19 generous use of the word "we".

20 COMMISSIONER BURTON: We, as a Board need more time 21 to really go through this. We should not receive an email 22 late last night, and we'd be voting on this matter today. 23 We should have more time. And I believe every one of you 24 actually agree on that. We can't get stuff late last 25 night and vote on it today. We have not gone through



1 this. We have not raised questions.

2 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Thank you so very much.

3 Commissioner Woods.

4 COMMISSIONER WOODS: Yeah. Through the Chair.

5 Aqain...

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6 COMMISSIONER BURTON: It's wrong.

COMMISSIONER WOODS: We received this information a 7 8 week ago. It wasn't yesterday.

COMMISSIONER BURTON: We didn't receive it a week 9

ago. The staff said they sent it out last night. 10

11 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: I'm going to ask...

12 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Pressley...

CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: ... to maintain the quorum... 13

14 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Put it on agenda for today.

15 COMMISSIONER WOODS: No, we received the materials,

16 Mr. Chair a week ago to be able to do our due diligence

17 on this. And so, I was in Washington, DC. I was supposed

to be at the National Prayer Breakfast. I skipped the National Prayer Breakfast so I could be here. I was there 19

20 all week. I was supposed to be there, and I got on a

plane early this morning, 6 o'clock this morning to make 21

22 sure I'm at this meeting so I can do my responsibility...

COMMISSIONER BURTON: This went out yesterday. 23

24 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Point of order Commissioner 25 Burton.



COMMISSIONER BURTON: No, for point of information.
 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Point of order Commission
 Burton.

4 COMMISSIONER BURTON: This came out yesterday. You
5 didn't get it a week ago. You got it yesterday.

6 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Commissioner...

7 COMMISSIONER BURTON: What date was it?

8 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Commissioner Burton. You have 9 not been...

10 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Point of information.

CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: You have not been recognized.
 Go right ahead. Commissioner Woods.

13 COMMISSIONER WOODS: Mr. Chair, I received the 14 materials yesterday and it was updated that we would put 15 it on the agenda for today. So it was on the agenda. The 16 agenda is different from the materials and the promotions, and so we received that information and I had 17 great conversations, not only with Mr. Brown, but with 18 others. And I also talked to DPD. I talked to his Chief 19 of Staff, and made some inquiries about all of the 20 21 promotions. I had a deep dive with him, and that's why I'm back here to make sure that our city have the product 22 that it need to continue to keep us safe. And so that's 23 24 why we're here for them. And I will leave it like that. Mr. Chair. 25



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CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Thank you. Any further
 discussion? Commissioner Bernard.

3 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: Just quickly. We have a Department of more than 2000 officers, and it's headed by 4 the Chief. And as you said earlier, if you have 5 confidence in your CEO, then you approve the persons that 6 he or she wants to promote. I'm not familiar with this 7 sort of... in corporate America doesn't exist, and in 8 business it doesn't exist in a well-run business. If you 9 have confidence in his recommendations and you approve 10 them and you move it forward. There's nothing really more 11 12 for us to do. Once the promotions have been reviewed by 13 OCI and by our staff, that's the end of it. That should 14 be the end of it. And in terms of a deep dive, 15 Commissioner, you know, the deep dive is a good thing 16 maybe, but as I said earlier to Deputy Chief Hayes, you 17 don't have to be squeaky clean to get my approval for 18 your promotion.

As a matter of fact, the person that has no dirt on their uniform never got in the game. So, all things happen in life, things happen in business. Things happen obviously in policing, but I'm interested in promoting those people who have shown the discipline and obviously the commitment to policing. And sometimes that means that you get your uniform dirty. So I'm more interested in



1 what the facts have indicated from OCI and everything else. I'm sorry, Mr. Chief, if that offended you. I didn't mean to, but I'm just saying, you could be a hell of a leader, and have had issues in terms of your career. CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Vice Chair, Bell. VICE CHAIRPERSON BELL: Mr. Chairman, I'm going to focus back on the lieutenant. I just want to endorse this promotion. This is a young officer I was familiar with when I was on the job. It's great to see one rise through the rank of her caliber. She was a quiet spirit during that time, but quite obvious she outlined all her involvement. I'm just pleased to vote in favor of her. CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Commissioner Banks. COMMISSIONER BANKS: Through the Chair. You know, I know you mentioned Commissioner Bernard, that we have to have faith in the Chief, and I agree that the Chief is a credible man, but I still have to see some documentation

on the officer, I still have to see it before I put my 18

19 stamp on it.

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20 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: I agree.

21 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Is there any further 22 discussion? Hearing none again, the motion on the floor 23 is to approve the Chief's recommendation to promote Lieutenant Dana Russell to the rank of captain. All those 24 25 in favor, please signify by saying, aye.



1 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

2 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: All those opposed, no?

3 COMMISSIONER BURTON: I abstain because I don't agree
4 with today's process.

5 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: The ayes have it.

6 Congratulations, Captain Dana Russell, and we hope for7 your speedy recovery.

CHIEF WHITE: Finally, I'm recommending to this 8 honorable body Lieutenant Fulgenzi, Matthew Fulgenzi. He 9 was appointed to Detroit Police Department on January 10 17th, 2007. As police officer, Captain Fulgenzi was 11 12 assigned to the Northwestern District. In addition to his 13 officer duties, he served in the Southwestern District 14 Patrol operations, the 8th Precinct Patrol Operations in 15 the B&E Taskforce, and the 6th Precinct Detective Unit. 16 On August 8th, 2014, Captain Fulgenzi was promoted by this honorable body to the detective and returned to the 17 6th Precinct Detective Unit. On December 16th, 2016, 18 Captain Fulgenzi was promoted to the rank of sergeant and 19 was again returned to Investigative Operations Detective 20 Unit. But this time of the 2nd Precinct. On May 5th, 21 2021, this honorable body agreed with me and promoted 22 Lieutenant Fulgenzi to, and that's a typo, and I hate 23 24 when I'm reading, and I find one to captain and we'll skip that. 25



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1 Captain Fulgenzi was also served as the Officer in Charge of the Investigative Operations Unit of the 11th 2 Precinct. On October 3rd Captain Fulgenzi took over the 3 Crime Intelligence Bureau or Crime Intel, where he served 4 as the Officer in Charge and currently served as the 5 Officer in Charge of Crime Intelligence, Notification 6 Control, AVERT and the Comstat Unit. Captain Fulgenzi 7 also serves as the Coordinator of our NFL Draft Task 8 Force for 2024. And that is a job he is coordinating with 9 the NFL, probably talking to me more than he wants to 10 every day about our strategy, our crime strategy. He 11 12 along with Commander Sonia Russell as well as Deputy 13 Chief Hayes, as well as AC Ewing. They coordinate all the 14 crime strategies for us, citywide all the special 15 projects, all the big events along with our metro 16 division and our Downtown Services. So they have their 17 hands full. The biggest thing that they do is prepare us 18 for big events. We were very well prepared for the Lions 19 parade, but unfortunately we can use those resources elsewhere. But they've done a really good job 20 anticipating and strategizing along those lines with any 21 and every event that we have. Captain Fulgenzi holds an 22 Associate of Applied Science and Law Enforcement, and is 23 24 currently pursuing a Bachelor's in Administration in Cybersecurity from Cleary University. I thought you were 25



1 at Wayne State.

2 CAPTAIN FULGENZI: Yes.

3 CHIEF WHITE: So you're at Wayne State or Cleary?4 CAPTAIN FULGENZI: Cleary.

5 CHIEF WHITE: You left Wayne State? Okay. Also,

Captain Fulgenzi has completed the 2023 Michigan State or 6 Michigan Police Executive Development Seminar sponsored 7 by the FBI and the Michigan chapter of the FBI. There's 8 great pride that I present to you Captain Fulgenzi, true 9 commander of the recommendation as you see in their 10 backgrounds. This is a strong candidate pool. I submitted 11 12 this paperwork over a week ago, or a week ago, and you 13 see that we look very long and hard at their backgrounds 14 in their citizens' complaints, and this is an outstanding 15 candidate pool for these positions.

16 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Thank you. Will. Captain 17 Fulgenzi please stand. Alright. So the Chair entertains a 18 motion to accept the Chief's recommendation to promote 19 Captain Matthew Fulgenzi to the rank of Commander.

20 COMMISSIONER WOODS: So move.

21 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Is there a second?

22 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: Second.

23 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: It's been properly moved and 24 second. Any discussion? Hearing no discussion, all those 25 in favor, please signify by saying, aye.



1 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

2 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: All those opposed, no?

3 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Abstain.

4 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: The ayes have it.

5 Congratulations, Commander Matthew Fulgenzi.

COMMANDER FULGENZI: Honorable Board. I just want to 6 start by saying thank you. Thank you for your confidence 7 in your vote. To Chief White, thank you. To the senior 8 9 management team here, thank you. To the field support team, AC Ewing, DC Hayes, Commander Russell, all the 10 command officers that are in this room, for mentoring me 11 12 throughout my career. I'm excited about this next chapter 13 of my career, excited about leading this great 14 Department, and most importantly, this community. Thank

15 you.

16 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Thank you.

17 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Through the Chair.

18 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Yes. Commissioner Moore.

19 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Where's the Commander going?

20 CHIEF WHITE: Hold that one. He's going Downtown.

21 He's going to be partnered with Dana. He's going to go

22 Downtown continue the work with the NFL draft and

23 strategize on the large crowds that we're expecting this

24 summer.

25 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Okay. Thank you. Let the



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record reflect again, this to your point. Commissioner 1 Burton has not been ideal. You know, obviously in ideal 2 circumstances, we would've preferred to have a several or 3 few weeks at least to read these documents. But I do 4 appreciate my colleagues flexibility and due diligence to 5 make sure that this gets done, because timing is 6 important on both ends. So one, that we have time to 7 actually vet the information, but also that these 8 individuals are in their proper positions in an 9 appropriate amount of time so that the business of the 10 Department doesn't wane or is hindered by having 11 12 vacancies and some very significant positions. And so, I 13 hope that we can work better and ensure that we can get 14 that time. But again, we are grateful that we were able 15 to complete this today. Anything further for the Chief's 16 report or comments for the Chief? Hearing none, again, let the record reflect that Commissioner Carter has 17 joined us. And again, thank you so very much, Chief. At 18 this time, we'll move forward to oral communications. 19 20 FEMALE SPEAKER: Good evening, Mr. Chair. We 21 currently have 6 speakers. I will call those present in the room. First. First, it's going to be Minister Eric 22 23 Blunt. Please share your name and speak directly into the 24 microphone.

25 MINISTER BLOUNT: Good afternoon Board.



1 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Good afternoon.

MINISTER BLOUNT: I am relieved that Commissioner 2 Bernard didn't ask the people being promoted to stand up 3 4 and you offer your personal and professional services to 5 them. So no one has to describe you as being similar to a 6 woman of the night. This whole process is corrupt. Let's 7 look at it. Basically, no one said anything when the 2022 Union contract was approved. That union contract 8 9 disallowed any disciplinary history to be considered when 10 someone is being promoted. It went even further to remove or reduce the retention period of police officers 11 12 disciplinary history. You have no other choice. You just 13 do what he says to do. We have seen this Chief and this Board promote police officers who have had over 88 14 15 complaints. And it just goes on and on. But Commissioner 16 Bernard, you say the quiet parts out loud. When you 17 threatened me one time in this meeting with a lawsuit, 18 you didn't say you were going to go to the Board of 19 Police Commissioner's attorney. You said you were going to go and talk to Conrad Mallet. You just proved that you 20 are not here for police officer misconduct. You are not 21 here about civilian oversight. You are here at the 22 23 service of the Mayor and the Police Department. That's all I got. 24

25 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Alright. Minister Blount, I do



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1 recognize that public citizens have the opportunity to make their comments. I know that you have a wealth of 2 words at your disposal. I just challenge that you try to 3 find a better set to describe what you're attempting to 4 describe in referring to my colleague. I do think that 5 6 there is a line that can be crossed, and I know that you can find a better set of words to use in describing what 7 you need to share. So I challenge you to do so. Thank 8 9 you. Our next speaker. 10 MINISTER BLOUNT: I'll take your recommendations

11 under consideration.

12 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Thank you.

13 FEMALE SPEAKER: Our next speaker will be Ms. Smith, 14 and after Ms. Smith, it'll be Mr. Ronald Foster.

15 MS. SMITH: Good afternoon.

16 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Good afternoon.

17 MS. SMITH: That's the day to day with the

promotions. I am very happy that I was here to see all of 18 this. And I wish sometimes our commissioners would behave 19 and understand what this body is all about and not keep 20 up confusion all the time. It is disgusting. We need to 21 get along. So with that said, and then also, I know we 22 23 have a right to say what we have to say, but sometimes you just go off board and it's not necessary. And that 24 25 includes some of the people that we have coming here and



1 speaking to you. You're doing a good job. I know this for 2 a fact because I've been around here longer than most of 3 you, been up in your age, 91 years. I started with the 4 Police Department in '73 under Coleman Young. So I do 5 know a little bit about the police still.

6 So I just wish you'd just behave and treat each 7 other with kindness and know that we are not going to be here long. So we have to do the best we can while we are 8 9 here. I have something that I want to discuss with, mainly for the parents. I don't want to talk about the 10 Police Department because you doing alright as far as I'm 11 12 concerned, when you do wrong, then I'll tell you about 13 it. But the parents are who I would like to address. If 14 there are any parents that's listening or know any, anything about what's going on in our city, crime and you 15 16 know, who's doing it? Our teenagers, I believe that if you have better control over your teenagers by knowing 17 who they associate with, where they go; if they're not in 18 19 school, why? Get a job. I raised 5. I think I done told you this over and over again. I'm proud of mine. But the 20 21 fact is, we parents have to do something more and attentive with our children. I know for a fact that this 22 23 is not getting any better. And then we have some grownups that's acting fools out here shooting and killing each 24 25 other. We don't need this. This is a lovely city. I came



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02/01/2024 1 here 1960 Labor Day and I fell in love with Detroit. CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Thank you. That's your time. 2 3 We missed you these last couple of weeks, so good to see 4 you again. 5 MS. SMITH: It's good to be seen. 6 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Indeed. 7 MS. SMITH: I missed you too. 8 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Our next speaker. 9 MR. FOSTER: Good evening. 10 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Good evening. 11 MR. FOSTER: Few things as we go into New Year. You 12 guys got a budget season coming up. The community, not 13 just myself, but the community is constantly complaining 14 about 2 staff members that you have. It's not going to go 15 unnoticed. It's not going to go unchecked. I advise that

16 you guys get those staff members that you have on the

17 payroll under control before you go to City Council with your budget meetings. The community is very adamant about 18

those 2 individuals, and the lengthy amount of grievances 19

20 that are unresolved; the ones that went without any

21 commissioner's signature. Those things are unacceptable.

22 \$250,000 in payroll that has to be addressed before you

23 all get to City Council with your budgets. Secondly,

24 ministers, we need more ministers in our community to

25 conduct themselves as ministers. That mean to judge



people righteously by first looking at yourself and 1 2 accepting the salvation that you had before you spit things out of your mouth and judge someone else. You 3 know, and Matthew 15:11, it says, it's not what goes into 4 5 the mouth of a man that defiled some, but it's what comes 6 out of them that defiles a man. Thirdly, we need public servants to be public servants not to have an agenda, not 7 8 to pick any sides. I don't favor anybody, but I do like 9 the policies of Ms Waterss. I can say that despite competition or personal things, she do ensure that public 10 11 safety have the things that they need when it's brought 12 to their attention. Not just IOS, but the Public Safety 13 Committee, as well as very involved in what's going on in this community and ensuring that we all have what we need 14 15 to have a safe community. So I appreciate you all for 16 listening. We need more ministers in our community to 17 combat the stuff that we have going on, and be a part of 18 it.

19 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Thank you. That's your time. 20 And then let me also remind our public commenters to make 21 sure that your comments are to the Chair and not to any 22 other individual.

FEMALE SPEAKER: We'll go into Zoom. The first caller is Caller 124, and the next caller after that will be Ms. Parks, Ms. Laura Parks.



CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Caller with the last three 1 2 numbers 124. Caller with the last number, 124, are you 3 there? All right, we'll come back. Next speaker. 4 FEMALE SPEAKER: Getting them unmuted. 5 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Unmuted. Okay, we can wait. 6 Oh, while we're working on that, Mr. Brown, why don't you 7 go ahead and give us our announcements. MR. BROWN: Good afternoon, Mr. Chair. The 8 9 announcement. The next BOPC community meeting will be Thursday, February 8th at 6:30 PM with the 11th Precinct 10 hosting at Solomon Temple's Church. That address is 2341 11 12 East Seven Mile. That's Solomon Temple's Church. And then 13 next community meeting will be Thursday, March 14th at 6:30 PM with the 10th Precinct hosting. And Mr. Chair, 14 that location is forthcoming. The monthly committee 15 16 meetings scheduled for February, 2024. We have the Policy Committee meeting on Tuesday, February 6th at 5:00 PM, 17 18 and we have the Citizen Complaint Committee meeting on 19 Tuesday, February the 27th, also at 5:00 PM. Mr. Chair, all those committee meetings would take place here at 20 21 Public Safety Headquarters and they could also be viewed 22 on Zoom.

23 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Thank you. We still working 24 out the sound?

25 MR. BROWN: Mr. Chair, you want me to see if I can



1 assist her?

2 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: I think we have Ms. Blossom 3 trying to work that out. I'm trying to be efficient here. 4 So why don't you go ahead and give us the Secretary's 5 report as they continue to work. And if we aren't able to 6 get it by then, then I'll add you to the team.

MR. BROWN: Alright. Mr. Chair, there are currently 7 7 incoming correspondence and I'll highlight a couple of 8 them. Last week. DPD submitted their fiscal year 2025 9 budget and I call it/presentation. And CCRs also, I mean 10 from a request from the Board for CCRs outcomes to 11 12 sustain cases requests. That is also in your package 13 behind tab number 6. The BOPC Fiscal Manager submitted a 14 one page update for the process of the budget from the 15 Board, all the way to City Council. And that's also in 16 tab 6 in your binders. And Mr. Chair, based on that that needs to go to the budget subcommittee so they can then 17 get the full presentation, which is part of the budget in 18 order to bring it back to this Board. 19

20 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: So you said this last item of 21 the DPD budget update from Mr. Fries needs to go to the 22 budget subcommittee.

23 MR. BROWN: Correct, sir.

24 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Alright. Well, let's send that25 to budget.



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1 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Mr. Chairman.

2 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Yes. Commissioner Moore.

3 COMMISSIONER MOORE: I have a quick question about 4 your report, Mr. Brown. Do you know, and maybe this is an 5 OCI question, what's the difference between dismissals 6 and termination?

7 MR. BROWN: I'll leave that to...

8 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: So this is on the chart that 9 the graph that was provided to us? So Chief Investigator 10 Warfield, do you have a response on the difference 11 between a dismissal and a termination?

12 CI WARFIELD: Sir, no, I do not. This is actually the 13 first I'm seeing this, so I do not, I can get that 14 information and get it back to you.

15 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Thank you. Who created this 16 document?

MR. BROWN: Through the Chair. This report camethrough from the attorney, I believe through DC Ha.

19 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Okay. Thank you. All right, we 20 ready?

21 FEMALE SPEAKER: I'm going to move on to former22 Commissioner William Davis.

23 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Okay. Former Commissioner24 Davis.

25 MR. DAVIS: Good evening. Can I be heard?



1 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Yes, you can go right ahead. MR. DAVIS: Okay. I'd like to start off by saying I'm 2 pleased to hear that the number of auto thefts and 3 carjackings is down. Hopefully you all could do a greater 4 5 effort to reaching out to insurance companies to help to 6 get our insurance down because we pay a high amount of 7 insurance in this city, and anything we can use to help to make the city more affordable the better. Also, I was 8 9 pleased to hear that that 2 employers that had been a problem and that we had been constantly talking about at 10 City Council because I talked to City Council every week 11 12 and a number of other people do like Mr. Foster. And so 13 when you do have people that have been doing questionable 14 things and been on the city role, you know, getting money 15 that they shouldn't be getting, that's troubling. I talk 16 to people all over this country and people from all this country talk to me regularly about a number of things, 17 but, you know, frequently it's about our auto insurance 18 and about this Board of Police Commissioners. I think the 19 Board is actually moving in a better direction than it 20 21 has been quite some time, you know other than the last 22 person you all promoted as Vice Chair. Have a great day. 23 Thank you.

24 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Thank you.

25 FEMALE SPEAKER: The next speaker will be Denise



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1 Lyles, and after her it will be Ms. Victoria Shaw.

2 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Okay. Denise Lyles. Denise3 Lyles.

4 MS. LYLES: Good afternoon, honorable Board. Can you
5 hear me?

6 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Yes, we can. Go right ahead. 7 MS. LYLES: Great. I didn't get the police reports 8 because I did get on a meeting late, but I remember from 9 before you had quite a few young people that had applied 10 for the youth Board of Police Commissioners

11 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: At the Youth Advisory Council, 12 yes.

MS. LYLES: Yes. Thank you. And I'm with District 5 AC and we're looking for a young person to be on the Board. I'm just asking, can you ask some of your youth if they would like to participate? They have to live in District 5, though.

18 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Yes. We'll make sure that Ms.
19 Blossom connects with you to ensure there's some youth
20 representation.

21 MS. LYLES: Thank you and have a great day.

22 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: You too.

23 FEMALE SPEAKER: Ms. Shaw.

MS. SHAW: Good afternoon. Commissioners, this is Victoria, President of the Grand River Community Block



1 Club. The Board recently approved some significant staff positions that are needed to provide well-rounded 2 civilian oversight. I would like to welcome and 3 congratulate the Board's recently onboarded civilian 4 oversight analysts for the Board to have a staff member 5 dedicated to independent analysis of OCI and DPD data has 6 potential to be a significant win for Detroiters. I look 7 forward to public reports coming soon. Can the Board 8 9 please provide the public a status on all open positions, including the following? Executive Administrative 10 Assistant 2. The Board approved this budgeted position to 11 12 provide legal assistance and research supporting the 13 Board Secretary and Attorney. Legal questions arise from 14 the Board OCI and administrative staff in the fulfillment 15 of various duties such as investigating complaints, 16 policy analysis, and others. The position was posted and all applicants were shared with the Board prior to the 17 2023 holiday recess. And to my understanding, the Board 18 has not reviewed candidates as of yet. 19

The Executive Policy Manager position. If this position is now vacant, I hope the Board will prioritize its posting and interviewing of candidates. Not only will it provide a resource to provide the Policy Committee support in addressing the backlog of DPD policies for review, but would also provide a resource to partner with



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1 the fiscal manager in grant writing for increased funding for oversight. And then finally, open investigator 2 positions. The Board is budget to appoint, I think it's 3 4 at least 3 more investigators in those positions were posted and applicants were shared with the Board on 5 January 11th. And I don't think interviews have happened 6 with that either. And we are well aware of the backlog. 7 The city's fiscal year ends on June 30th. Each day a 8 9 position is open, causes the budget to be underutilized and some component of oversight to go unfulfilled. So 10 filling a position should be a priority. Thank you. Have 11 12 a good evening. CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Thank you. Do we have caller 13 14 124 back? 15 FEMALE SPEAKER: I'm going to try that one more time, 16 and I'll try Ms. Parks again. 17 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Okay. FEMALE SPEAKER: And they're still not able to. 18 19 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Okay. MS. PARKS: Hello? 20 21 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Hey there. MS. PARKS: Yes, this is Ms. Parks 22 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Okay, go right ahead. 23 MS. PARKS: Okay. Yes. My question is, has the Board 24 of Police Commissioners disciplined Willie Bell from 25



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District 4, which is in Detroit, based on the IG report last year? That's what I need to know. Also, I need to know if you guys are looking at all of the complaints against the police officers before you all agree to give anyone a new position like a lieutenant or a sergeant or anything, because there are too many officers and too many complaints that we hear all across the city about police officers. Number one, half of them don't live in the City of Detroit, so they really don't have a vast interest in the City of Detroit. Once they come here, get

11 our tax dollars, they take it back to their city. So 12 that's the second part of it. But I thank you guys for 13 taking my call today.

14 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Thank you. Well, yeah. So I 15 would say that relative to a 2000, I think you said a 16 report from the OIG from last year that you may be 17 referring to, we can follow up on that. But relative to looking at complaints that are against officers prior to 18 promotions, yes, that is a part of our packets. We do 19 20 look at if there are any pending investigations, any internal affairs investigation, as well as how many 21 community citizen complaints have been filed against 22 officers prior to their promotion. Alright. Again, we 23 24 thank everyone for their public comment. And truly do appreciate you adding to the productivity of today's 25



1	meeting. After having already received the Acting Board

21	MR. BROWN: Vice Chairperson Bell - Yes.
22	MR. BROWN: Commissioner Smith - Yes.
23	MR. BROWN: Commissioner Bernard - Yes.

3	LaVille, on administrative leave without pay, but with
4	medical benefits.
5	COMMISSIONER BURTON: I'd like to make an amendment
6	to the motion, Mr. Chairman.
7	CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: But there hasn't been a
8	motion. So is there a second? It's been properly moved
9	and second. Is there any discussion?
10	VICE CHAIR BELL: Second.
11	CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Vice Chair Bell. Is there any
12	discussion?
13	COMMISSIONER BURTON: I'd like to make amendment to
14	the motion. Mr. Chairman.
15	CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Go right ahead.
16	COMMISSIONER BURTON: I'd like to amend that for
17	suspension for 3 days without pay for this officer.
18	CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: Hearing no second, there is no
19	amendment. Is there any further discussion on the motion?
20	Hearing none, again, this motion is to accept the Chief's
21	recommendation to place a Police Officer Serge LaVille on
22	administrative leave without pay, but with medical
23	benefits. All those in favor please signify by saying
24	aye.

25 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.



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1	CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: All those opposed, no?
2	COMMISSIONERS: No.
3	CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: I ask that Mr. Brown, take a
4	roll call vote.
5	MR. BROWN: Chairperson Pressley - Aye or yes.
6	MR. BROWN: Vice Chairperson Bell - Yes.
7	MR. BROWN: Commissioner Smith - No.
8	MR. BROWN: Commissioner Bernard - No.

1 CHAIRPERSON PRESSLEY: I thought two-thirds was a 2 matter of getting in and out of committee, but I thought 3 that it is just majority vote required. 4 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: No, that's not true. 5 VICE CHAIRPERSON BELL: Two-thirds. 6 COMMISSIONER BERNARD: It is two-thirds vote. 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
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
