CITY OF DETROIT  
BOARD OF POLICE COMMISSIONERS MEETING  
November 13, 2025

1 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Good evening. My name  
2 is Ricardo Moore, Chair -- {meeting in progress} -- of  
3 the Board of Police Commissioners.

4 We do not have a quorum at this time. We  
5 will go straight to invocation with Commissioner Cedric  
6 Banks.

7 COMMISSIONER BANKS: Thank you so much,  
8 Chair.

9 Father, we just thank you right now for who  
10 you are and all you've done. We thank you for the  
11 Board of Police Commissioners tonight, in the name of  
12 Jesus. Father, we thank you for the audience that's  
13 here tonight. We praise you for them. Lord, we're  
14 asking you to bring forth a quorum tonight. We have a  
15 resonance that's here and hungry to hear from the Board  
16 of Police Commissioners, whom by your spirit we're  
17 asking for you to have -- we're asking for that to  
18 happen tonight in your name. In Jesus name we praise  
19 you. In Jesus name, Amen and Amen.

20 Thank you, Chair.

21 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Amen.

22 Thank you, Commissioner.

23 At this time we'll go straight to public  
24 comment.

25 MS. UNDERWOOD: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

1           Our first speaker will be Ms. BeLinda Lee,  
2   then Mr. James E. Ford, and then Former Commissioner  
3   William Davis. When you come to the mic, please state  
4   your name for the record.

5           MS. LEE: Good evening. My name is BeLinda  
6   Lee, I am the new president of the 2nd Precinct  
7   Community Relations Council, and I look forward to  
8   working with all of you and also our new Commissioner  
9   Victoria Camille.

10          Thank you.

11          MS. UNDERWOOD: Mr. Ford.

12          MR. FORD: I see great things in our Police  
13   Commissioner, Mr. Bettison.

14          My name is James Ford, I'm from -- I just  
15   want to say God bless everybody. God bless everybody  
16   that's here. God bless everybody that wanted to be  
17   here, that could not be hear.

18          I take my hat off to the Police Commissioner.  
19   He's a special person. He's confident. And I hope you  
20   tell him what I'm saying, and I'm sure he's listening.

21          You know, we ought to be glad that we got him  
22   because I see a man that's working hard. He accepts  
23   the task and he's dedicated to the task. You can see  
24   that in every move he makes. He's strategic and he's  
25   concerned. He's always moving. He's a good role model

1 for the younger police that's coming behind him. He's  
2 a good role model for the youth in the neighborhoods.  
3 And again, I'll say he's a good role model for the  
4 police that are coming up behind him. He's a perfect  
5 role model for the youth in the neighborhood. He's on  
6 TV, he's in the news. He plans his work and he works  
7 his plan. You can see that. And I'm a good judge of  
8 character, because I was in the swimming pool for 30  
9 years with 60 people for six different periods, so I  
10 know character when I see it. We got a leader against  
11 crime. He's fighting crime and he's trying to do all  
12 he can.

13 Chief Bettison, wherever you are, I hope  
14 you're listening to me, God bless you, God bless all  
15 your efforts, God bless the work that you're putting  
16 in. And I hope the people here in the city get behind  
17 you. I hope they stand behind you, and I hope they  
18 work and see it. I see it in you. God bless you, sir,  
19 wherever you are.

20 Thank you.

21 MS. UNDERWOOD: Former Commissioner William  
22 Davis.

23 MR. DAVIS: Hello, everyone. Can I be heard?  
24 Yes, yes, yes.

25 Well, it's a joy, you know, to see that there

1 are some changes coming for the Police Commissioner.

2 I think some of you all have done an  
3 outstanding job. I think there's always room for  
4 improvement, but I'm pleased.

5 Just yesterday I talked to Chief Bettison and  
6 invited him to have the city come back to the Detroit  
7 Metro ALPACT. Because that's been me. I was part of  
8 that before I became commissioner, throughout the time  
9 I was commissioner and since I've been off the Board of  
10 Police Commissioners, also.

11 For those who don't know, the Detroit Metro  
12 ALPACT is made up of community leaders and police,  
13 civilian and civil leaders, what have you. Because  
14 normally we have representatives from different police  
15 departments. We have -- just, you know, recently, like  
16 I say, I helped -- we selected, for the law enforcement  
17 side, with me being the civil side chief co-leader of  
18 it, we got the Dearborn chief of police. Normally we  
19 have state and federal officials, county officials.

20 So I'm looking forward to perhaps having  
21 maybe someone from the Board that might start coming to  
22 it, too, because it's a powerful vehicle to help change  
23 what's going on. We have state legislators, and we had  
24 proposed legislation before and during my term.

25 For the next two years I'm going to take an

1 active role in helping to facilitate greater  
2 corporation between police and law enforcement and the  
3 community at its very levels.

4 So I welcome the fact that Chief Bettison is  
5 going to start be sending people back to the ALPACT  
6 meetings, and I'm looking for a lot of changes.

7 Thank you.

8 MS. UNDERWOOD: Thank you.

9 We're going to Zoom.

10 Our first speaker will be caller with the  
11 last three digits 039. Then after 039 we'll go to the  
12 caller with the last digit 482.

13 Caller, go ahead, you have the Board.

14 MR. CROWLEY: Can everyone in the room hear  
15 me clearly? Can you hear me clearly?

16 MS. UNDERWOOD: Yes, sir. Go ahead, please.

17 MR. CROWLEY: Okay. This is Young Blood, aka  
18 Rhuben James Crowley, Jr. And I want to take this time  
19 to announce my attempt to run for the Michigan State  
20 Youth First District for senator of the State of  
21 Michigan. I intend to form a exploratory committee and  
22 I'm going to come out with the truth.

23 Janice M. Winfrey and Gina Avery Walker and  
24 Daniel Baxter have been cheating in Detroit elections  
25 for years and years and years and years.

1           The Detroit Police Department, Michael -- and  
2   Derrick Maye attempted, because I stopped them, they  
3   just attempted to coverup the murder of Kaniesha  
4   Coleman, DPD Case 20-11112.

5           Now, it's going to take extra, extra,  
6   extraordinary measures to get her daughter Nene what  
7   she wants. She wants you'll. That's the City of  
8   Detroit Board of Police Commissioners, Detroit Police  
9   Department and everybody in SNS who was saying that her  
10   mother killed herself.

11           Scharmaine McCloud did it. I'm going to say

3 about that one since we can't FOIA the information.

4 And speaking of FOIA'ing the information, I  
5 hope Conrad Mallett is sitting there, and just in case  
6 he's not, he'll hear it when he sees this video. I  
7 sent a request for a FOIA back in September, on the  
8 5th, you all just responded to it yesterday, after I  
9 requested it repeatedly. And then it came to \$200  
10 bill, and that is half, because you really wanted \$400.  
11 I send you an e-mail this afternoon that you did not  
12 respond to. I do not have any interest in paying \$200  
13 for a FOIA that I know does not require a \$400 payment.  
14 It is in the interest of the public. And at this point  
15 I would like a response from you about the e-mail that  
16 I sent today; otherwise, I am going to move on to the  
17 next step.

18 Thank you. You all have a good night.

19 MS. UNDERWOOD: Mr. Chair, that's your last  
20 speaker.

21 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Motion to adjourn.

22 COMMISSIONERS: Support.


