## Site Location & Zoning

7.2 SD-4 Zoned

The proposed use aligns with both the zoning ordinance and the City's Master Plan.

### **Requested Approvals**

The applicant seeks general site plan approval from the City Planning Commission, with final site plan details to be determined in coordination with City Planning Commission Staff.

Under SD-4 zoning, City Council has the authority to review and approve site plans, after recommendation from the City Planning Commission, for sites with three acres or more.




# **Project Vision**





## **Additional Site Considerations**



#### **PEDESTRIAN ACCESS**

 Safe, universally accessible pathways connect all major site components, incorporating crosswalks, lighting, and intuitive wayfinding to support people of all ages and abilities and encourage walkability.

#### **CONNECTION TO RIVERWALK**

• The plan creates a direct, landscaped corridor to the riverfront, preserving visual access and integrating spaces for public use.

#### **PARKING (192 SPACES)**

- The plan offers approximately 132 parking spaces for visitors, along with around 60 spaces for the WNBA staff and team.
- Screening will be installed to limit views of parking from the Riverwalk

#### TRAFFIC FLOW

- Internal circulation is designed to minimize congestion, with defined entry and exit points, separate service routes, and directional signage for smooth movement.
- A traffic engineer has been engaged to evaluate potential impacts and inform any proposed changes.

#### **GREENWAY INTEGRATION**

 A future greenway area is reserved to link the site with the City's greenway network.

## **Universal Design**

### **Exploring Universal Design & Community Priorities**

- a. Continuous, barrier-free pathways connecting courts, fields, and community spaces
- b. Smooth entry points for all users, including those with mobility devices
- c. Ramps and elevators integrated for seamless movement between levels
- d. Generous circulation areas in lobbies, corridors, and conference rooms
- e. Visual Support, including high-contrast signage and tactile cues for intuitive navigation
- f. Inclusive and family-friendly restrooms with accessible fixtures
- g. Accessible seating areas near fields and courts
- h. Incorporating input from local stakeholders and advocacy groups to promote inclusive design and equitable outcomes

# **Sustainability Efforts**

### **Sustainability Considerations**

- a. Site Reuse: Transforming a former industrial site into a community-focused sports facility
- **b. Stormwater Management:** Underground stormwater detention system designed to meet or exceed DWSD standards, fully sealed to prevent any subsurface contamination. The team is reviewing potential direct discharge to the Detroit River in coordination with regulatory agencies
- **c. Energy Efficiency:** High-performance HVAC, LED lighting, and smart controls, water-saving fixtures, etc.
- d. Native Landscaping: Planting regionally appropriate species to reduce irrigation needs, support pollinators, and improve soil health
- e. Waste Reduction: Recycling programs integrated into facility operations
- f. Wildlife Impact: Evaluating strategies to minimize impact on birds and other wildlife through design and operational practices
