Committee Actions and Recommendations:

- **102.13 – Personal Protection Orders Against Members and 305.3 Detainee Registration:** These directives were discussed; however, due not the absence of a quorum, no formal action was taken. These items will be brought back for consideration and vote at the next policy meeting.

Public Comment:

- Rella Landfair (Michael\$ Momma) recommended that, in missing persons cases, a Detroit Police Department (DPD) representative (e.g., staff member, retired officer, or chaplain) accompany families during search efforts to provide guidance on canvassing and offer support. She noted this approach could help bridge the gap between the community and DPD. Sergeant Walker indicated he would facilitate a connection between Ms. Landfair and Chaplain Stinson to discuss the recommendation further.
- Molly Moening expressed concerns regarding the use of ShotSpotter technology and suggested that associated funding be reallocated to community violence intervention programs.
