Staff finds the work appropriate for the following reasons:

The following work items meet the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation Standard 6) Deteriorated historic features shall be repaired rather than replaced. Where the severity of deterioration requires replacement of a distinctive feature, the new feature shall match the old in design, color, texture, and other visual qualities and, where possible, materials. Replacement of missing features shall be substantiated by documentary, physical, or pictorial evidence.

Front Porch Rebuild - Home

- Porch to be built to original design and specifications as shown in provided plan, reusing existing brick and limestone with new concrete floor surface
 - Existing overhang to remain, brace during construction
- Tear down existing porch, clean existing limestone and brick for reuse
- Dig out foundation under porch, stabilize earth, rebuild foundation with cinderblock
- Rebuild porch walls with existing brick and limestone
 - Any new brick used to match existing brick as close as possible
- Pour concrete floor

Please retain this Certificate of Appropriateness for your files. You should now proceed to the City of Detroit Buildings Safety and Engineering Department to obtain a building permit.
