I am writing as a shareholder at 1300 E Lafayette Cooperative. I believe that the commissioners have received a large volume of letters requesting that you do not grant Detroit Thermal a permit to do the necessary work over at the Mies van der Rohe cooperatives from its residents for many different reasons. Some are angry and some are emotional. I am asking that the members of the commission disregard the noise and consider only what your charge is - Ensuring the preservation of historically and culturally significant areas of the City.

When one looks at the total area of the land involved it is easy to see that a very tiny area is impacted at all. Detroit Thermal has reworked their plan to include practically all of the suggestions and requests that we asked for. I also understand that it is an election year and so politics can come into play. I respectfully ask that you don't consider anything other than the fact that there will be some digging that will temporarily inconvenience the residents and disturb a couple of bushes and a tree. All of the planting will be replaced. Nothing historically significant will be gone forever.
