Replacement Window Application

An application for replacement windows in a historic district <u>must</u> include these items.

- a) A City of Detroit <u>Application</u> for Building Permit #2.
- b) A <u>brochure</u> or other information about the proposed replacement window that shows
 - i. that the *configuration* of window panes is the same as in the original window,
 - ii. the *material* from which the replacement window is constructed,
 - iii. that the *color* conforms to the *Style and Color Guide* for the building, and
 - iv. the cost estimate for *each* proposed replacement window.
- c) Two (2) written repair cost estimates from experienced and reputable window repair companies.
 - i. They must use the Commission's standard cost estimating worksheet.
 - ii. The Level I Preservation-Weatherization section of the worksheet shows the *minimum repair necessary* to preserve a window and to weatherize it.
 - iii. <u>This section must be completed</u> for each window to show the cost for each window of those repair items.
 - iv. The cost of other desired repair items also can be shown on the worksheet.
- d) Photographs (digital preferred) showing the deterioration of each window.
- e) A <u>statement</u> from the applicant with the <u>reasons</u> for proposing replacement windows.
