Hi Ben.

I have attached photos of my windows. After taking the photos outside I want to replace 4 windows with white vinyl windows. None of them are visible from the street or any public angle so they do not compromise the integrity or mission of the Historic Society to 'ensure the preservation of historically and culturally significant spaces' in the city.

What the windows do accomplish, however, is to maintain the aesthetics of my home and since they are original to the house they are drafty. The window off the kitchen falls out if I touch it. Further, brown vinyl windows are hard to find and more costly than the white vinyl. The 0% home improvement loan from the city is for moderate to low income families. I am determined to be frugal and strategic with the funds. The plan is to replace the windows with ones that are the most cost effective and energy efficient. I would like to replace the kitchen window that faces my neighbor's south wall with a plant window. I have attached a photo. We have not identified one as of yet.
