North side, facing Chicago Blvd




Added a few more photos of the exterior north side, similar windows are also visible in street pictures dated 2011 or earlier, all the windows on this side are same style, material looks like PVC, we found a mark dated 2017 so we are assuming changes happened then for this section.





Master Bedroom windows facing North to Chicago Blvd, as all the ones facing North, they look all changed during same time and PVC type material, assuming 2017.



Family room on main floor facing North, same as previous, all same type and kind of PVC material, assuming 2017.

Family room (right side taller window) is the same style as all the ones facing North, and installed clearly at same time, PVC material, assuming 2017.

Main entry, small window to the right of the door is original to the house (see detailed photos attached)



Dining room area on main floor (two windows)




On this section, windows facing Byron St are the same style, they also look like PVC material, and potentially changed around same time than the ones facing Chicago Blvd, assuming 2017.

Photos from 2011 show similar windows, but we are assuming changes were made in 2017.

On the second floor facing Byron St we have one bedroom, and the master bedroom and bath (right side). On this section, windows facing Byron St are the same style, they also look like PVC material, and potentially changed around same time than the ones facing Chicago Blvd, assuming 2017.

Attic windows material is wood, while they are not original, they don't look as changed at same time than main and 1^{st} floor. Assuming 2010 for a mark on the glass.



Back side (south) of house facing alley and Longfellow St

For this back side we have not been able to find any old photo, only one from 2011 shows originally a garage was attached to the house from where today's is the backyard/driveway door.

On this elevation only one window is original (top one on third floor staircase) that on below photo is the top center one.



Main floor ones (side of dining room) look like changed earlier than rest of dining room (potentially when garage was demolished) and material is wood, most of them damaged and with some "repairs" on the inside with screws to fix position of window. I was able to find a mark and windows look from 2010.





All this windows are from Andersen and built/installed in 2010. They are all the same on south façade (facing alley) ... on the picture is not easy to see the engraving.




1st floor bedroom

Basement access window, one window, PVC material dated 2017.




Family room, two windows around fireplace, left one is original, and quite damaged. Right one is wood and dated 2010.
