


Trae Isaac

As an artist and community advocate in Detroit focusing on city history and neighborhood empowerment, I have made large-scale public installations on abandoned buildings for over ten years, as well as murals in partnership with communities in Southeast Michigan. In all of my work, I focus on bringing to light alternative histories that may otherwise be papered over by a more mainstream agenda. I work with the community and local historians to determine the activists, musicians, artists, scenes, and other figures to depict in public paintings. I work not only on beautifying the area but also rebuilding lost infrastructure. By weaving together many different elements, such as a variety of historical portraits in a sitespecific public installation, I create accessible, multifaceted portraits of people and places. Through my art, I transform urban and industrial spaces into colorful and invigorating installations that tell hidden stories.





My paintings involve bold, black and white portraits layered with vibrant colours, images of moments in Black history, and painterly depictions of clouds and stars. The clean graphic details are meant to captivate the viewer, reminiscent of a stencil image used in street art. I am very intentional with how I use colour and composition in my work in order to create an emotional resonance with the viewer. Often, I use cool blues and purples to create a solemn tone to the work, but I'll include a bright, complementary colour such as orange or hot pink as a drop shadow to represent hope for the future. I apply layers of acrylic paint in a sheer, watery wash so that they give the appearance of watercolour on canvas. This gives the paintings a dreamy appearance.




Wendy Popko
