

Fitzgerald by the numbers

THE PROJECT

- A total of 373 city-owned parcels of land will be transferred, pending City Council approval
- **323 parcels** will be transferred to the developer Fitz Forward, a partnership between local development firms Century Partners and The Platform
 - 115 parcels have vacant houses that will be rehabilitated
 - 20 percent of housing across the board will be affordable housing for residents making 80 percent or less of the area median income.
 - These homes will be a mix of for sale and rental single family units.
 - 16 parcels have blighted structures that will be demolished. The lots of these structures will be landscaped
 - 192 additional vacant lots will be cleaned and cleared, replaced with community gathering spaces and low-maintenance landscapes like orchards and flowering meadows.
- 50 parcels will be transferred to the city's Parks and Recreation Department
 - These parcels will create a **new 2 acre park** in the center of the neighborhood to meet a need for greater recreation and civic spaces.
 - The park will anchor a brand **new ¼ mile long greenway**, a walking and biking path, to bring better connectivity to the community

TARGETED TIMELINE

April 11

Land transfers will be up for City Council approval

120 days from council approval

Fitz Forward must secure all vacant structures and clear all vacant lots.

July 2017

• The city will begin work on the park and greenway. More than 60 blighted houses have already come down, with only a few remaining before park construction begins

September 2017,

• Construction begins on rehabbing 115 homes, installing landscaping on 192 lots and demolishing the 16 homes that will become landscaped lots.

December 2017

• Ella Fitzgerald Park will be completed this year.

March 2018

· Greenway will be completed this year.

Fall 2019

 Fitz Forward is required to complete the entire project within two years of the start of construction.
