COMMUNITY MEETING #3

On June 8th, we had Community Meeting #3 at the Equity Alliance. We introduced the community to the neighborhood Framework and shared what we learned from the previous two meetings. These findings were presented and categorized based on the Framework elements.

We asked the community to imagine Midwest-Tireman in the year 2033. The activity was to role-play as someone else ten years from now and put yourself in their shoes to describe the now thriving Midwest-Tireman area to one of their new neighbors. Participants were given areas around Warren, Tireman, and Sherrill school sites as their future residence locations.

The goal is to envision what is desired in the neighborhood, help the framework process, and determine a path toward implementation.
