

Another \$525,000 targeted repair of basement flood backups in Jeff/Chalmers Community for an additional 70 homes.

Detroit Councilwoman Mary Waters Turns to Students to Curb Child Shootings with Gun Locks



“Waters, a former teacher, is going to schools to provide gun locks to children who sign pledge cards promising to deliver the locks to households with unsecured firearms. Waters went to Carleton Elementary School on the city’s east side to talk to students about gun safety and provide gun locks that were distributed by teachers.”

“There were so many hands that went up when we talked about guns in homes,” Waters tells Metro Times. “It was pretty clear that some of these kids already know about guns in their homes. And that’s the scary part.”
